Lester Perry and Pearl Jane Powell

Lester Perry Powell, 75, Mesa, Ariz., a former McDonald resident, died Sunday, Jan. 14, 2007, at his home.

Pearl Jane (Fox) Powell, 73, Mesa, Ariz., a former McDonald resident, died Monday, March 12, 2012, at her home.

Lester Powell was born Jan. 31, 1931 to Robert Perry Powell and Martha Jane (Watkins) in Cheyenne County, on the family farm northwest of McDonald.

Pearl Powell was born Nov. 22, 1938, to Bernard William Fox and Eunice Louise (Loghry) at home in the Wind River Indian Reservation city of Riverton, Wyo. Much of her World War II childhood was spent in Wyoming, Utah, Nebraska and Colorado until she eventually was placed under the care of the Catholic Nuns operation St. Ephrasias Children's Home in Denver. Upon aging out of the Foster Care System she began working at the Powell Nursing Home in Scottsbluff, Neb.

In the early 1950s the couple met and were married in Scottsbluff, Neb. They raised their four girls in McDonald raising cattle and wheat farming.

Mr. Powell did custom combining, volunteer fire fighting, building a water tanker for McDonald's Fire Department, driving an ambulance as an Emergency Medical Technician and was eventually McDonald's Town Judge. He volunteered his piloting skills with the Antique Threshing Show, Civil Air Patrol, Capper Foundation for Crippled Children, was a District Director of the Kansas Flying Farmers and attended the local Masonic Lodge for over 50 years.

Mrs. Powell participated in UNICEF fundraising and Easter Star, as well as, Tupperware, Avon and Stanley sales. She was also an artist having made several oil and acrylic paintings under the tutelage of Marilyn Frisbie of McDonald.

In 1986 the couple moved to Mesa, Ariz., where he worked for Rogers Corporation at Chandler, Ariz., until he retired in 1996. They
