Shutout makes Cowgirls league champions

The Cowgirl softball game against Colby started on April 16 was finished on Monday, without the rain this time, and despite having a 2-0 lead the Cowgirls couldn't get their bats to connect and four runs in the sixth inning by Colby gave the Eagles a 4-2 victory.

The second game, which decided the Great West Activities Conference champion, was a much more the typical Cowgirl game: a 9-0

The Cowgirls have a overall record of 15 wins and three losses and a conference record of nine wins and one loss. Their next game is at 3:30 p.m. today at Ellis.

The first game picked up where the two teams left off in April in the middle of the first inning with Colby batting. Heileigh Shull batted first and started with no balls, two strikes and was struck out by freshman pitcher Stephani DeLaRosa. Jenessa Williams followed hitting a fly ball that was caught by the second baseman Lindsay Bauman for the second out.
