Art show to be in Colby

The final date for entering artwork in the Juried Amateur Art Show is May 25. The show, put on by the High Plains Art Club, will be held on June 8, 9 and 10, in Colby's Heartland Christian School gymnasium at 1995 W. Fourth Street.

Money prizes will be awarded for first and second places in each of eight groups: oil, watercolor, acrylic, pastel and charcoal, graphite pencil and colored pencil, mixed media, sculpture, and ceramics and pottery. There will also be a money prize given for Best of Show. Ribbons will be awarded for the People's Choice Award and the Judges Merit Awards.

Age limit for the show is high school age and up. An entry fee of \$15 will be charged for every two entries. There is no limit on the number of entries each artist may submit.

Each artist or their representative must bring their artwork and pick up their work.

World War I traveling exhibit to be in Hays

The "Honoring Our History" Traveling World War I Exhibition will be in Hays located in front of the Ellis County Historical Society Museum, 100 E. 7, Hays from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. (Mountain Time) on Friday, May 18, and from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. (Mountain Time) on Saturday, May 19. The World War I Exhibit will be open free to the public - and is designed to honor veterans, as well as support cultural institutions as it travels to 75 cities across the country.

Hays is the 46th stop on a 75-city tour. The World War I Traveling Exhibition will be in Hays for two days only.

In addition, the Traveling World War I Exhibition will travel to three other Kansas locations in May and June.

Waddell & Reed's traveling exhibit, in partnership with the National World War I Museum, will allow visitors to experience the sites and sounds of World War I - and Honor World War I veterans and all veterans since. Visitors will experience the tight conditions of trench warfare, see the relatively primitive tools, weapons, equipment and uniforms of a war from 100 years ago.

The two founders of Waddell & Reed, Chauncey Waddell and Cameron Reed, were World War I veterans. The exhibit include Cauncey Waddell's flight gear, his flight suit and log book.

The exhibit is an 18-wheel traveling museum.
