Mrs. Price loved music and played a violin in high school and continued playing with a group at different functions in St. Francis. She was a member of the United Methodist

Church and was cherub choir director for 25 years. Mrs. Price was very active in the St. Francis Music Club and was president and a state officer. She was also a 4-H leader for several years and a Home Extension Club member.

After her husband died in 2006 she moved to Gothenburg in November 2008 to Stone Hearth Estates Assisted Living to be closer to her daughter and her family. One of her favorite past times was reading.
