The Goodland High School golf team finished the regular season with a win at the Brewster meet last Tuesday and second place at the Great West Activities Conference tournament in Hugoton on Thursday.

At Brewster, the Cowboys placed first with 355 team points. Oakley came in second with 368 and Wallace County came in third with 399.

Gage Ihrig and Joel Linin tied for first with 78. Ihrig won a play-off for the top spot.

Tim Fugleberg placed ninth with 98. Jonah McClung shot a 103.

No team scores were kept for the 9-hole junior varsity match.

Tanner Helton placed ninth and Matt Murray placed 10th. Each shot a 52. Keegan Bowling shot a 63.

At the league tournament, the Cowboys placed second with 324 team points. Ulysses came in first with 319 and Colby was third with 327.

Gage Ihrig finished second, shooting a 76. Linin also shot a 76, finishing fourth. Gannon Ihrig placed seventh with 82.

Taryn Bedore placed third in the 300-meter hurdles with 50.63. She also placed fifth in the high jump with 4 feet, 4 inches and fifth in the 100-meter hurdles with 17.9.
