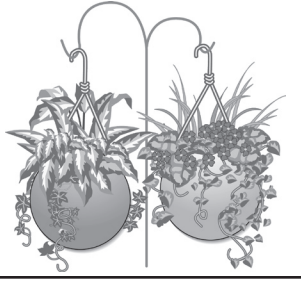

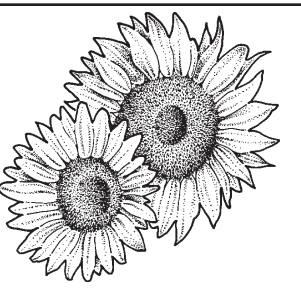

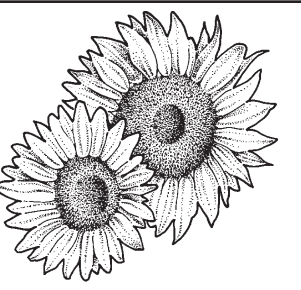

Marching and musical instructions are under the direction of Nathan Gay and his Emporia State band staff. Band camp ends with performances in the Shrine Bowl parade in the morning and a pre-game and half time performance at the Kansas East-West Shrine Bowl Football game on Saturday evening, July 28.

The marching band is a project of the Kansas Masonic Foundation. Sponsorship for Coates and Schnabel is paid by the Goodland Masonic Lodge.

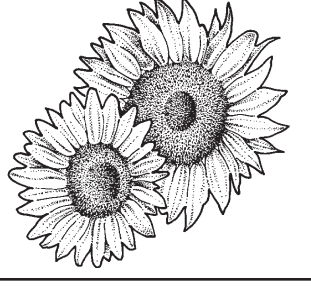

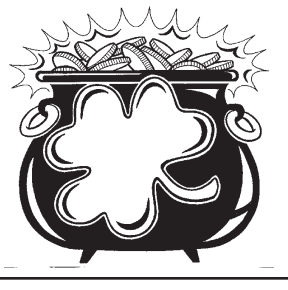

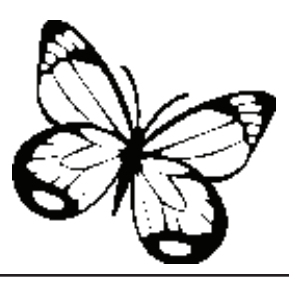
