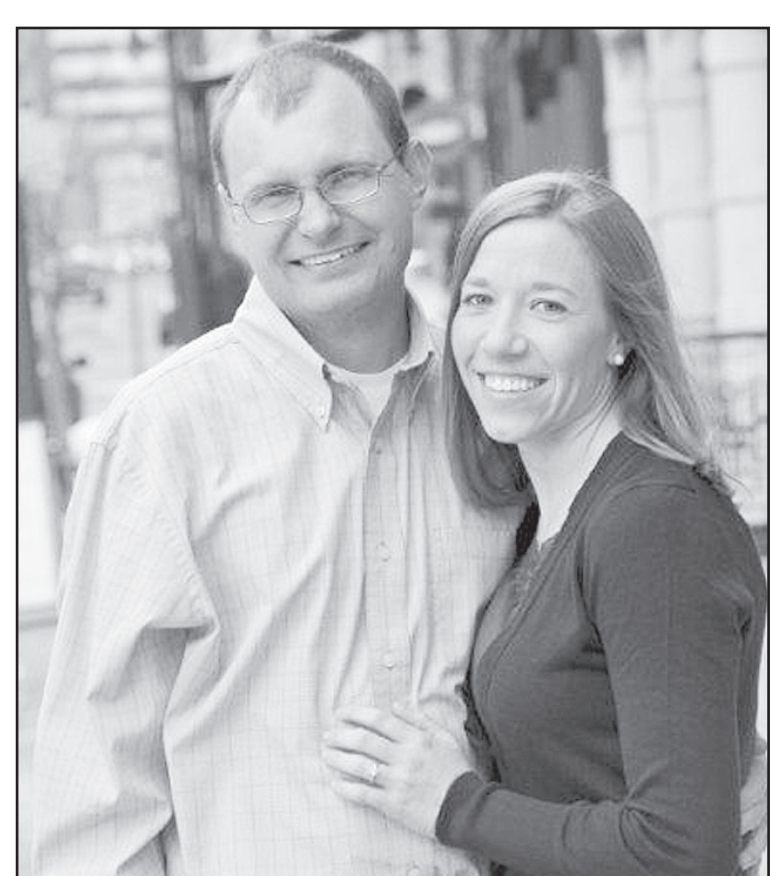
Visitation was from 2 to 7 p.m. on Wednesday, July 11, 2012, at Bateman Funeral Home, 11th and Broadway, Goodland.

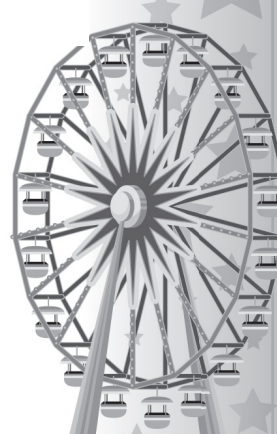
