her department's task is primarily focused on unemployment benefits. Brownlee reported that in July, Kansas unemployment rates increased from 6.1 percent to 6.3 percent, but a lot of workers dropped out of the workforce during that time.

"That may be a sign that the stock market has turned around," Brownlee said. "We believe that older workers are starting to feel like their

investments and retirement funds are back at a comfortable level and they are choosing to retire. The workforce shrunk, so there is a higher unemployment rate."

Brownlee touted the state's turnaround on job growth as a sign that the Kansas is headed in the right direction for people looking for work. "In July 2011, Kansas was at the bottom of job

growth. We were 48th or 50th," Brownlee said. "In July 2012, we were 18th."

Overall, the state leaders reported, the new tax regulations will positively affect the Kansas economy, but emphasized that it won't be im-

"2014 is going to be a tight year," said Revenue Secretary Jordan, "but it will get better from there. We're projecting 6 to \$9 billion of new revenue for the state and we will get our first severance tax returns in mid-October, so that will be an early indication of the bottom line."
