her department’s task is primarily focused on unemployment benefits. Brownlee reported that in July, Kansas unemployment rates increased from 6.1 percent to 6.3 percent, but a lot of workers dropped out of the workforce during that time. “That may be a sign that the stock market has turned around,” Brownlee said. “We believe that older workers are starting to feel like their

investments and retirement funds are back at a comfortable level and they are choosing to retire. The workforce shrunk, so there is a higher unemployment rate.” Brownlee touted the state’s turnaround on job growth as a sign that the Kansas is headed in the right direction for people looking for work. “In July 2011, Kansas was at the bottom of job growth. We were 48th or 50th,” Brownlee said. “In July 2012, we were 18th.”

Overall, the state leaders reported, the new tax regulations will positively affect the Kansas economy, but emphasized that it won’t be immediately clear. “2014 is going to be a tight year,” said Revenue Secretary Jordan, “but it will get better from there. We’re projecting 6 to \$9 billion of new revenue for the state and we will get our first severance tax returns in mid-October, so that will be an early indication of the bottom line.”

Webinar offered for tax-exempt organizations

In the wake of recent weather-related disaster declarations, the Internal Revenue Service is rebroadcasting its webinar titled: “Starting and Operating Charities for Disaster Relief.” The rebroadcast is free and will be available on Thursday, Sept. 20, 2012 at 1 p.m. Eastern Time. The webinar will explain the basic requirements for starting a tax-exempt disaster relief charity and the ways new and existing organizations can properly provide disaster

relief under federal tax rules. This webinar will cover a variety of topics including: rules for recipients of disaster relief; The various types of help organizations can provide; deductibility of contributions; and operational and recordkeeping requirements for both fundraising and working with volunteers. Charitable organizations have traditionally been involved in providing assistance to victims of disasters, like the severe storms,

tornadoes, straight-line winds, and flooding that occurred in Kansas in April 2012. Enrolled agents and registered tax return preparers can earn one continuing education credit if they participate in the Webinar for a minimum of 50 minutes. Other tax professionals may receive credit if the webinar meets their state and organization continuing education requirements.
