

Cowgirls come in seventh at state tourney

The Goodland High School varsity girls golf team ended up seventh at the Class 4A State Tournament on Monday in Hesston. There was a tie and playoff for the state individual medalist. Timbrelle McNair from Girard, who shot a 72, was the overall state champion. Buhler, the host school, won the team championship with a 360.

The Cowgirls ended up with a 404 team score, placing seventh out of 12 teams.

Logan Perryman shot a 96; Emily Purvis, 98; Megan Siruta, 102; Cortney Cowan, 108; Katie Hays, 109; and Jordan Knitig, 110.

"I am really proud of the younger girls today, Logan, Emily, and Katie, as this is Logan's and Katie's first state tournament and Emily's second," said coach Connie Livengood. "They played some good golf today. Emily Purvis had a personal best

score and that is what it takes at the end of the year to finish strong."

Perryman, a freshman who has lead the team in scoring this year, had two holes that kept her from medaling but finished strong, Livengood said.

"She never folded and that is a sign of a good golfer," the coach said. "Megan Siruta had a better day today and was consistent. Cortney had a few holes which really took

away from her scoring today and Jordan Knitig as well."

Livengood said all 14 girls on the team did very well this year.

"I am very proud of the girls," she said. "We had some up and down moments, but when you really look at it we have had that at most of the tournaments this year."

"The team came together this year as a team. Someone always came through for

the team. They won a lot of tournaments together and they lost a few together."

Livengood said she enjoyed coaching the team and had a lot of fun. The girls listened and tried hard to do what was asked of them.

"I enjoyed the season and I am looking forward to a great season next year," she said.

In the boys junior varsity, Kyler Amthor placed second with a time of 18:51; Yidam Mendoza, sixth with 19:30; Jarod Lake, 21st with 21:06; Daniel Cepeda, 36th with 23:16; Hunter Harkins, 38th with

23:42; and Christian Michaud, 53rd with 31:39.

In the girls varsity, Lacie Siruta placed third with a time of 17:18, earning a medal and All-League

honors; Sierra Estes, 26th with 19:27; Lindsey Geeseka, 27th with 20:06; Teryn Tompkins, 35th with 21:09.

and Cowgirls will be the Class 4A Regional Competition on Saturday at Buhler. The girls team will run at 10 a.m. (Mountain Time) and the boys team at 10:30 a.m.


