## Citizens urged to report crimes

With news coming out about last week's roundup of suspected narcotics dealers as well as questions over vicious dog laws, Goodland Police Chief Cliff Couch and Sherman County Sheriff Burton Pianalto are reminding citizens about the importance of reporting crimes.

People are sometimes reluctant to report crimes in small town because they may have to testify against their neighbor.

"That's the challenge of living

in small town, you're going to see them again," Couch said.

Pianalto said law enforcement would not be half as effective if not for tips from the public.

"It's difficult to step up," Pianalto said. "Sometimes you get beat up a little, but if you want to bring about a good change in your community, you have to."

Pianalto recalled a case several months ago where the golf course clubhouse had been broken into. That case was solved by a neighbor calling in a suspicious vehicle.

Couch pointed to last weeks drug busts and said that narcotics cases are extremely difficult to build and often take months. Tips from the public are a big help.

"Nobody wants trouble, but the reality is that's the only way we get traction in these cases," he said.

Couch said there are only about 15 officers out of a 4,500-member community.

"If we're going to win, the community has to step up and say, 'you guys are in the wrong,'" he said.

There are ways to report crimes

and remain anonymous, including the Crimestoppers hotline, (785) 899-5665 which is run by Sherman County Dispatch and allows people to make anonymous reports. Couch said there may even be rewards for tips that lead to solved crimes.

There are multiple other ways to contact local law enforcement officers, by calling the non-emergency numbers for the police at 890-4570 and the sheriff's office at 890-4835. Pianalto said that if people feel uncomfortable, law enforcement can keep their name out of it as much as possible. In some cases, he said, tips can lead to other information, so law enforcement can build a case without using the original tip.

However, Pianalto said, law enforcement officers do not want the public to take the law into their own hands.

"We don't want people to go out and do the crimefighting," he said.

## All bonds for the school district sold

Dustin Avey of Piper Jaffrey reported to the Goodland School Board at their regular meeting on Monday that all of the \$14,995,000 bonds have been sold for the district's renovation projects.

"It's been a challenging two weeks in the bond market," said Avey. "Rates have been volatile."

Superintendent Bill Biermann said the district had itself S&P rated. The district was rated A+ which was good.

Avey said they bought bond insurance which raised the rating to AA. The insurance guarantees the bond purchaser to get their money.

Biermann said the insurance cost \$35,000 but reduced the interest rate on the bonds by .2 to .25 percent. It is thought to reduce the interest paid by \$300,000.

The district's bonds were divided into two groups. One group for \$9,535 million as general obligation bonds that were bank qualified with

a lower interest rate. The other group for \$5,460 million were tax general obligation bonds.

Avey said he hopes the sales tax will have more revenue than expected and that the district will be able to retire the bonds before 20 years.

Reorganization for the board included:

- Keeping the meeting time at 7 p.m. on the second and fourth Monday of the month at the administration building.

- Approved the destruction of the old records that were scheduled.

- Allowed the district to pay necessary bills before a board meeting by state law.

- Adopted a 1,116 hour calendar for the school year. This is the last year a school calendar will be published as next year it will be digital.

- Appointed Jeff Mason as the district's attorney.

- Selected The Goodland Star-News as the district's official newspaper.

- Set up the petty cash funds for the

district office and the high school at Bankwest.

- The activity funds for the high school and Central Elementary School were at First National and for the junior high and West Elementary at Bankwest.

- Selected Bankwest, First National Bank, Western State Bank and Peoples State Bank to be used for district idle funds.

- Voted to allow no first or second mortgages on property owned by the district.

- Appointed board member Teresa Sieck as the board's representative on the board of the Northwest Kansas Technical College with former board member Mike Cochran as the alternate.

- Appointed Mike Hamilton as the district's representative to the Northwest Kansas Educational Service Center in Oakley with Jennifer Golden as the alternate.

- Appointed Becky Schulte as the district representative for KPERS with Mark Scheopner as assistant.

- Appointed Superintendent Biermann as the district's representative for the food service program with Steve Raymer as the assistant.

- Appointed Superintendent Biermann as the district's representative for transportation with Raymer as the assistant.

- Appointed Sieck and Ron Vignery to the KASB Governmental Relations Network Representatives.

- Appointed Diane Stiles and Lee Ihrig to the bid committee with Jessica Cole as the alternate.

- Appointed House and Vignery to the policy review committee with Stiles as alternate.

- Appointed House and Stiles to the insurance committee with Hamilton as alternate.

- Appointed Hamilton to the Professional Development Council with House as the alternate.

- Appointed Sieck as lead and Cole and Hamilton to the negotiations team.

- Appointed Biermann as the representative for Federal programs

and as the Freedom of Information Officer.

- Appointed House with Stiles as the alternate to the calendar committee.

- Appointed Stiles with Ihrig as the alternate to the technology committee.

- Appointed Biermann as the purchasing agent for the district.

- Appointed the school principals to the wellness policy representative with Biermann as the contact.

- Set the district mileage rate at 56 cents per mile for private vehicle.

- Set the pay rate for emergency substitute teacher at \$85 per day and with a teaching license at \$100 per day.

- Appointed Vignery and Hamilton as the alternate to the evaluation review committee along with Biermann and West Elementary Principal Verna Milnes.

- Hired Don Smith as the girls basketball assistant coach for next year.

## Executive branch has too much power

Congressman Tim Huelskamp met with a standing-room only crowd for a town hall meeting Monday in the Sherman County commissioners room at the courthouse.

Huelskamp said Goodland was his fifth town hall of the day, and said he appreciated the opportunity to hear his constituents speak their

minds. Huelskamp said overall Congress and the courts have ceded too much power to the executive branch, going back decades, through several presidencies.

"Government power will end up in tyranny unless it's limited," he said. "Now, government is limited unless you can get a majority and the president to sign off on it."

To stop the executive branch from

doing something, he said, you have to have the votes to take away the money.

Huelskamp said his votes are consistent with the 10th Amendment, which grants all powers not specifically stated in the Constitution to the states.

"Do I think we'll get through this stretch? I do," he said. "We'll get through it because of the character of the American people."

During the meeting he covered a variety of topics:

### Economy

Huelskamp said most economists say the supply of money should increase along with growth. However, in 2008, the government printed a mass amount of money.

"They thought it would grow," he said. "It didn't."

Huelskamp said Federal Reserve Chairman Ben Bernanke will be

gone within a year, and that the person he would like to fill the position, Esther George – the president of the Federal Reserve Bank of Kansas – likely won't get the position.

Social Security and Medicare are a large part of the economy and the government budget, Huelskamp

Precautions may keep teens safer on the road

More teenage motor vehicle fatalities happen in summer than any other time of year. While teen driving statistics are troubling, research shows teens whose parents set rules are half as likely to get in an accident.

The National Association of Insurance Commissioners, of which the Kansas Insurance Department is a member, has compiled tips for parents and teens to make driving safe and save money.

The ultimate goal when our kids start driving is to ensure their safety and the safety of others. That starts with establishing expectations. The good news is setting boundaries provides the opportunity for the roads to be safer for everyone, and fewer accidents is a goal we can all get behind.

**Setting Expectations**  
Inexperienced, distracted driving, speeding and drug/alcohol use are major contributors to teen-

44 percent of teens say they would speak up if someone were driving in a way that scared them.

These safety measures also may help save money on auto insurance, because even minor fender-benders can drive up costs.

**Keeping Costs Down**  
Parents know, too, that vehicle insurance for teenagers is expensive. That's why it pays to follow some useful advice from the insurance experts in making sure you can keep premium costs as low as possible. Here are some of them.

• Encourage teen drivers to keep his or her driving records free of accidents and moving violations for at least three years. Many companies grant discounts to "safe drivers."

• Enroll new drivers in a defensive driving course. Some companies offer discounts for completion.

related crashes. One way to help your teen become a safer driver is to talk openly about your expectations for when they're behind the wheel. Here are some discussion items.

• Set a driving curfew. More than 40 percent of teen auto deaths occur between 9 p.m. and 6 a.m.

• Put a limit on the number of passengers allowed in your teen's car. For teenagers, the relative risk of a fatal crash increases as the number of passengers increases.

• Make the cell phone off limits while driving. Talking and texting on a cell phone can double the likelihood of an accident.

• Encourage your teen to exercise his or her rights as a passenger. Only

• Some companies may offer driver awareness programs, either online or with a smartphone app for young drivers. Ask your insurance agent or company if there is a discount for using these programs.

• Encourage teen drivers to keep their grades up. Many insurance companies offer discounts or preferred rates for teens at particular grade point average levels.

• Ask your insurance company about an "accident forgiveness" clause that guarantees premiums

will not increase after one minor accident.

• Consider a higher deductible and only allowing the teen to drive the family's oldest, least expensive car. The type of vehicle also will affect the policy premium. SUVs, convertibles and performance vehicles typically cost more to insure than other cars.

While education and preparation can help, accidents still happen. If you or your teen are involved in one, make sure you know what

steps to take to stay safe and protect your identity when exchanging information for a claim. The insurance coucil's free WreckCheck app (available at iTunes® and Google Play®) guides users through what to do — and not do — after an accident. The app helps drivers collect necessary information on the spot, then immediately emails a report to your home and your insurance agent.

Rex has three children he is very proud of: Jandi Smith, Lawrence Kansas, Zeb Smith (Rachel), Goodland Kansas and Spencer Smith, Goodland Kansas. He has one grandson, Brayden Smith of Goodland, Kansas.

Rex was a member of the Goodland Elks Lodge #1528 and was honored to serve as Exulted Ruler and currently as a trustee. Rex belonged to the Tri-State Antique Engine and Thresher Association Inc., a member of the SAR (Sons of the American Revolution), member of the Lost Dutchman's Mining Association, and member of the Kansas Water Well Association. He attended The Missouri Auction School in 1998 and enjoyed going to auctions where he always found "treasures"! In 1976 he became one of Goodland's part-time finest, officially called the "Reserve Force." He loved doing patrols and being on a shoot was the highlight while on duty. An outstanding memory of his was getting pepper sprayed by accident from a fellow officer on a routine traffic stop.

Rex loved riding motorcycles, dirt bikes and taking trips to the mountain with friends. Rex was an avid racer and built his own stock car, enduro car and cruiser — he was fast and had trophies to show off. In high school he tried his hand at football and riding bulls at the Dewey Ranch. He loved flying and with a friend purchased a Powered Parachute which they loved flying and even went to Missouri for a big fly-in. On Friday the 13th his wife convinced him they needed to try jumping out of an airplane and off they went to the Steerman fly-in at St. Francis, KS where they each did a tandem jump. Often you could find Rex cruising down Main Street in his '67 GTO with the windows down. If you asked Rex about his car he

would tell you he had the car longer than his wife! Rex enjoyed his trips to Sturgis and would often remark "What happens at Sturgis stays at Sturgis". Rex and Colleen opened their hearts and home and became foster parents giving children in need a helping hand. Rex was a history buff and enjoyed watching countless hours of the history channel which inspired him to research his own family history and put all the pieces together to join the SAR. His children also belong to the DAR/SAR. Rex enjoyed hosting AFS exchange students and hosted a student from Paraguay in '96. When the exchange students requested to see snow Rex and his friends/family loaded up the

group of exchange students and drove to the mountain so they could see snow only to return home where it had started snowing. Rex and Colleen never missed a Sunday evening movie at the Sherman Theatre with friends. Even if the movie was not a hit they still enjoyed their buttery popcorn. One of Rex's hobbies included restoring antique and classic cars. Rex's last project was helping Spencer finish his '73 Chevy Nova. Rex was proud and honored that Spencer joined the Army and even signed his enlistment papers before he turned 18. Rex loved gold panning in the mountains and took Zeb gold panning for a weekend at the Lost Dutchman's mining association camp in the Rocky Mountains. Zeb has continued the tradition with his son Brayden. Jandi enjoys traveling and in 2011 convinced her dad to take a family trip to New York City to see the Addams Family musical opening night on Broadway. While in New York the family spent several days sightseeing and by sheer accident ended up at the Intrepid Sea, Air & Space Museum where Rex could have spent days in the museum. Rex's favorite holiday was the 4th of July. He spent many nights with his children/nieces/nephews at the fireworks stand that always had a place on his land. In honor of his memory all the cousins were together this 4th of July celebrating Rex's life.

Rex will be missed by many including his wife, Colleen, his children, Jandi, Zeb (Rachel) and Spencer, grandson Brayden, along with brother Dale (Brenda Smith) sisters Joyce (Gary Meyer), Linda Smith of Goodland, and Debbie (Jimmy) Crocker of Colorado Springs, CO., many nieces and nephews. ## Are we up to the coming challenges?

Holidays like the 4th of July and Flag Day in June remind us of the sacrifices made by many individuals over the years that have kept our country free. It is easy to overlook or forget the personal cost involved.

With the war scheduled to wind down in Afghanistan are we as a country prepared to meet the challenges that comes with the return of veterans who have served more than one tour of duty in a "war zone." Are we prepared to take the veterans and their families into our communities and deal with the medical and mental problems that war causes. Not only are we talking about the head traumas and wounded limbs but the wounded minds that will act out or try to find relief through drinking and drugs.

Are we up to the long-haul care for abused spouses and children who will have post traumatic stress problems of their own?

We are hoping there is more confidence from the veterans that the Department of Veteran Affairs will be able to treat them. There have been signs that the V.A. and the military are trying to make mental health care more available as well as more acceptable. The V.A. has tried to shorten waiting times for veterans seeking its services. They hope with using things like telemedicine they can reach out to veterans not in immediate area.

The military's softening attitude toward mental health care has come with the price tag of an increasing number of suicides amongst service members.

When someone commits suicide they have reached a point of that they feel they have no other option left. The person creates a circle of in-pain relatives and acquaintances that must pick up the pieces.

This may be one of those times that the military itself leads the charge into changing people's attitudes toward mental health care as something not to be ashamed about. Maybe the time is coming that total health care includes care of the psyche.

The rest of the community is not exempt from the care that needs to be given to veterans and their families. Will the school be ready to handle the problems the children of those families? Will the neighbor and friend be willing to listen if the veteran or his family need to talk? Are the pastors of the churches prepared to hear things no one wants to hear and provide the comforting words from a caring God? Are there enough 12-step or life groups available to those who need them?

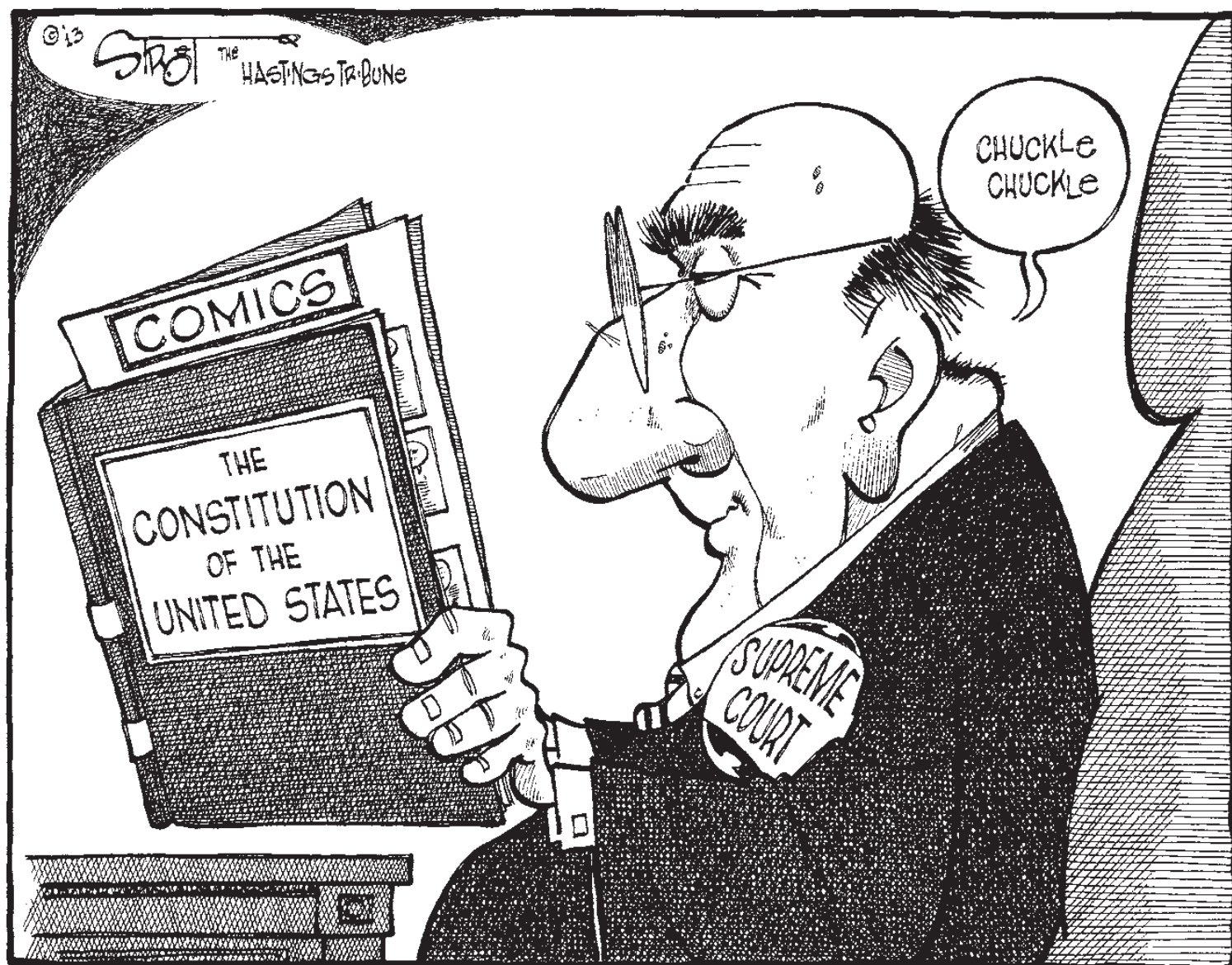

## High altitude didn't slow her down

My doctor will be so proud of me.

Five weeks ago, I was in a hospital bed getting blood because my red-cell count had bottomed out. On the Fourth of July, I was dancing at almost 9,000 feet elevation.

I'm not saying I was dancing the Cotton Hi Jo/Cotton-Eye Joe or that I danced for long, just two or three dances, a couple of slow ones, swing dancing to a fast tune. And sit down. But I was upright and gliding across the floor in Steve's arms at the old Elks Lodge in Creede, Colo.

In between my hospital stay and my stint on the dance floor, I did two things. I stopped taking an over-the-counter pain medication I had been taking for a long time for an elbow problem and I had a small operation to remove the source of my bleeding.

Those two things, both of which I should have done a long time ago, probably saved my life. That, and a visit to the doctor because I was feeling so weak and my head felt like

there was a windmill up there pounding away.

I've never been sick much, and it took a bit to prompt me to go see the doctor, but he and the surgeon fixed me up, and I've been on rehab for the last month or so.

We had been planning to go to Creede the day after I got slapped in the hospital and pumped full of new blood.

Every time we come out here, however, it takes most of week to get used to the altitude, and the first few days we're pretty sluggish.

I realized that even with that normal red-cell count, there isn't enough oxygen up here to make me feel good for the first few days. With a low count like I had last month, I would

probably just get altitude sick and end up in the emergency room.

So that trip was cancelled.

But last week, I was feeling good. My blood count wasn't quite up to normal, but it was close. If I just relaxed and didn't try to do too much, I figured, I'd be fine.

Besides, we really needed to get out to see what the fires, which are still burning, had done to the area.

All our friends were OK, and so far, no houses have been lost. I took it easy for most of a week. We took gentle walks and finally, the last two days, we went on some easy trail hikes.

But what do you say to your friends when they greet you with, "Hey, long time no see. How're you doing?"

Well, you lie of course.

"Great. Fine. Good to see you too."

And then, one day, it really isn't a lie at all.

## Do dogs have more rights?

It has become very apparent to me that the dogs of this town have more rights than I do, (I guess that's to be expected from such an ungodly society that gives more money to help protect animals than it does to help humans). I state that as a matter of fact because I have complained to the "animal control" in regards to all the barking that goes on here in the 500 block of west 10th. How mis that possible, when the "community" doesn't go through this property and why hasn't it been injurious to me? The only thing that has been injurious to me has been mentioned in the above paragraphs. Another thing I would like to know is why is it that my yard has been like this for a little over a year and there are several properties, including some businesses a lot worse than mine and has been for many years. It truly seems that I'm being discriminated against and harassed.

I am at the end of my rope and the city just threw the last straw that broke this "camel's back".

If there is someone out there who is willing to help, I would greatly appreciate it.

# Executive branch has gained too much power

said. Baby Boomers are retiring at a tremendous rate, he said, and once their benefits are paid, there will not be enough money to pay for the next generation of retirees.

Huelskamp said the changes to these programs have to happen now.

"I think people my age should be asked to work a little but longer," he said. "It's easier to tell someone who is 40 that they have to work till they are 66 than it is to ask someone who is 65."

### Farm Bill

Huelskamp said there were some good things in the most recent draft of the Farm Bill, but he voted against it because most of the bill has become about food stamps. The food stamp program needs reform, he said, because there are 3.5 million Americans who are able

bodied with no dependents, but who are on food stamps.

"We have to make certain they go to those who need it and who qualify," he said.

### NSA Surveillance

Huelskamp said he did not know about the NSA's surveillance programs — which allows the agency to collect phone and e-mail metadata, but not the contents of those calls unless they get a court order. Huelskamp said he looks on it as an attack on the Fourth Amendment, which guards against unreasonable search and seizure. NSA officials had lied to Congress about the programs.

"If you lie in public, who's to say you're not lying in secret," he said. "Their approach is to collect all of it because you might need it someday. General warrants are against the constitution. You have

to have probable cause."

He said there were a lot of parts of the Patriot Act that were kept secret from him.

"They don't tell me what's in the classified part of the bill," he said.

### Immigration

Huelskamp said the immigration bill that passed the Senate would not be coming up in the House, which has its own bill. The Senate bill, he said, allows the president to claim that the border is secure without it really being so. There has also been a lot of talk about whether the increase in border patrol agents would really impact the situation.

"Hiring people doesn't equal security," he said. "It depends on how you use them."

### Lesser Prairie Chicken

Huelskamp said one thing he has been working on is fighting against the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's

attempt to list the lesser prairie chicken as an Endangered Species, which he said would affect farming, ranching, power companies and more. Huelskamp said he got word last week that the process will be delayed by another six months.

Huelskamp said the wildlife service was trying to push the measure through, but there is a voluntary program that will solve the problem. He had told federal officials that Kansas has been in a drought, so it would be natural to see prairie chicken habitats on the decline, and that even then the population of prairie chickens in the state was up 30 percent. He said he was told that people have to make up the difference, and Kansas would not be given time off because there was a drought.
