

"Local farmers are very conservation conscious," he said.

As district conservationist, Wedel manages the Natural Resource and Conservation office. He works with farmers and ranchers on resource concerns such as crop and rangeland health, rotational grazing, tillage, waterways and terraces. He works mainly with Sherman County producers except when there is some overlap with neighboring counties. Sherman County, along with Thomas and Sheridan, is part of a three-county Home Management Unit. Wedel said the unit shares personnel as needed.

Wedel works with producers The transfer was an easy one, on coming up with conservation During the field season, Wedel said he helps producers get their planting practices implements and terraces designed and installed. Wedel takes producers what he calls the "Nine Steps of Planning" which includes deciding on overall goals, identifying concerns and how to address them, choosing a course of action and implementing that choice.

> Wedel is originally from McPherson County, where he attended Ghoshal High School. He graduated from Kansas State University, after which he moved to a small farm near Burlington.

Man walks across U.S. to honor fallen warriors

pjschiefen@nwkansas.com Joe "Tiger" Patrick II has decided to spend his time walking from Coronado Beach, near San Diego, to Walter Reed Hospital in Bathesda, Md., to honor military service members killed in Iraq, Afghanistan and other places. He started walking on April 28 and hopes to be in Maryland by October.

"I felt a compelling need to do something to honor to our fallen heroes, to give people a close up view of those we lost. This isn't a political statement, but an expression of love and respect for those who volunteered to put themselves in harm's way to protect us here at home," said Tiger. He honors the fallen by carrying a memorial mosaic panel which contains a picture of every fallen warrior.

On the the day he passed through Goodland before the Fourth of July he said that he had tried to connect with Derrick Lutters' mother while he was in Burlington. Lutters – who was killed in Iraq in 2005 – is pictured on the panel. The panel is 25-feet long and weighs over 50 pounds. Patrick said he has put almost two years of research into the banner.

He said sometimes it is hard to find the picture of the fallen soldier, his story and information on his family. Currently there are 6,688 pictures on the panel and unfortunately he said there will be more before the U.S. withdraws from Afghanistan

Former Goodland resident plans ride through Kansas

colby.society@nwkansas.com Fromer Goodland resident Joe Hickert will attempt a bike ride this summer like he's never attempted before, riding north to south across Kansas on a 225-mile, one-day trip.

The ride will raise money for the American Cancer Society, but Hickert says it is more than just a fund raiser.

"People continue to thrive in the face of adversity," he said. "You don't have to have cancer to be a survivor."

Hickert is originally from Graham County. He worked at EagleMed in Goodland before joining Thomas County Emergency Medical Services as director. Hickert said he has ridden as much as 100 miles in a day and has participated in Bike Across Kansas a few times, but this will be his longest oneday trip so far.

He has not picked a date for his ride because he wants to ensure the weather is good before he sets out, but he is planning for Aug. 17 or 24, both Saturdays. He said the ideal riding weather includes a 20 mph

Preparing documents can simplify recovery

And, while those who are affected can be anxious to put the experience behind them, the re-building process can be slowed by a lack of essential information.

"In times of loss, law enforcement officials typically require identification before allowing homeowners to inspect their property," said Elizabeth Kiss, Kansas State Research and Extension family resource management specialist.

"Insurance companies and emergency management teams also will require identification, proof of ownership, insurance coverage, etc., to begin the claims process," she said.



Debate issues, rather than verdicts

from our viewpoint...

The not-guilty verdict in the Trayvon Martin case has caused a public uproar across the country. Obviously, with the public attention focused on the case, there was no way it wasn't going to cause an uproar, no matter what the verdict was.

Armchair legal analysts took to Twitter, radio shows and anywhere else their voices could be heard as soon as the jury announced that George Zimmerman had been found not guilty of murder. No one was arguing that he didn't kill the teenager in last-year's scuffle, but the defense, successfully, argued that the state could not prove murder without a reasonable doubt.

People across the country are coming down on both sides, just as they have in every major trial throughout history. But whether or not you believe Zimmerman was guilty, this process is how justice is served in this country.

Everyone has the right to a fair trial. The Fifth Amendment to the Constitution guarantees that no person shall be "deprived of life, liberty or property without the due process of law." The Sixth Amendment says "In all criminal prosecutions, the accused shall enjoy the right to a speedy and public trial, by an impartial jury of the State and district wherein the crime shall have been committed, which district shall have been previously ascertained by law, and to be informed of the nature and cause of the accusation; to be confronted with the witnesses against him; to have compulsory process for obtaining witnesses in his favor, and to have the Assistance of Counsel for his defense."

Just because the process didn't work to your liking, doesn't mean it didn't work. Society asked these six people to weigh the evidence and make a decision, and they did. The process is geared specifically toward making sure innocent men and women are not jailed or have their rights or property taken away because of crimes they didn't commit.

Disagree with this particular verdict all you want. This time it wasn't up to you. But how will you feel when it is? Those of you who have experienced jury duty will understand the tremendous weight on the shoulders of those citizens chosen to deliberate and deliver a just verdict. Do we always deliver perfect verdicts? No. Justice is a human construct and therefor it is inherently imperfect. But we do the best we can.

Furthermore, in this country we have the principal of "innocent until proven guilty." The national media as well as the unfiltered gut reactions of social media trolls have reversed that process. How many people out there assume that when they see a mug shot on the evening news, that person is guilty? Otherwise they wouldn't be on the news, right? We have all tried and decided these cases in our minds before they see the inside of a courtroom, but since we're not the ones who actually decide, why are we surprised when a jury goes a different way?

At the end of the day, though, there are plenty of issues surrounding this case that should be debated, including racial issues, stand your ground laws, community policing, etc. We should look at these trials and rather than get outraged by the verdict, ask ourselves the tough questions that affect society as a whole. The former accomplishes nothing. The latter can change society for the better. -Kevin Bottrell

What do these small business owners ask for from Washington? Get out of their way. Give them certainty, simplicity and a reduced tax and regulatory burden.


Small business owners want to know how to plan for the future. And instead of spending time complying with complex tax codes and regulations, they'd like to get back to their job.

he passes through. He plans to give the coat to the National Fallen Firefighter Memorial on their memorial weekend on Oct. 5 and 6 in Emmitsburg, Md.

He said he has no children and when he started having health problems he wanted to do something with his time. His mother died from alpha-1 antitrypsin deficiency, a condition Patrick also suffers from. The deficiency is a liver problem that impacts the functions of the lungs. He figures his lung condition will make physical activity harder in several years and he wants the banner to be his legacy.

Patrick said the walking has made him healthier. He walks at the most 35 miles a day and stops

for rest as he did in Burlington and Colby.

He hopes to reach Fort Riley by July 20.

Patrick said he decided to cross the country with his banner after doing a similar walk to memorialize the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks in 2011. He said that first walk had a huge emotional impact for him.

Although not a career soldier, he said, he was in the Army in the mid 1980s, left college to re-enlist and was in the 3rd Armored Cavalry Regiment during Operation Desert Storm. He left the Army again in 1993.

Patrick has also worked with Special Olympics.

The walk is part of what he wants to get done while he can, he said, "so I'll have no regrets at the end of the day."

Professor helps navigate healthcare laws

health care system begin to take effect in October, which means Roberta Riportella expects to be busy the next several months.

Riportella, the Kansas Health Foundation professor of community health at Kansas State University, is heading up an effort to help Kansans learn more about how the Affordable Care Act – often called ObamaCare – will affect them once the law goes into effect on Wednesday, Jan. 1.

In Kansas, it will most impact more than 365,000 currently without health insurance, many of whom will be required to purchase insurance from private providers authorized through a 'Marketplace Exchange.'

Kansans will begin making those choices when open enrollment begins Oct. 1.

The marketplace is intended to make insurance more affordable. Consumers will have a choice of private plans and qualifying indi-

Sweeping changes in America's viduals and families are eligible for same companies provide insurance the incentives for using preventive tax credits, she said.

Specific to Kansans:

• Providing dependent coverage to age 26 will benefit more than 25,000 young Kansas adults.

• Prescription drug discounts will save an average of \$615 per person.

 Rebates from insurance companies will total more than \$4 million.

• Areinsurance program for retirees will affect employees at more than 60 Kansas companies.

• Federal funding for public and private Kansas recipients will exceed \$90 million.

'I very much want people to know that I'm not saying ObamaCare is the best or the worst; it just 'is,' Riportella said. "It's the law of the land and I am here to make sure that people understand what the criteria are.

Thus far, three companies – Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Kansas, Coventry, and Blue Cross/Blue Shield of Kansas City – are approved to provide coverage for Kansans. Those
