Sherman County Historical Society Jan. 17, 1904: By order of the post office department at Washington, the name of the post office at Kanorado has been changed from Lamborn to Kanorado.

On the Rock Island time card, Lamborn has always been known as Kanorado, and in order to have the town known by the same identical name, the change was made, and henceforth the confusion of two names for the same place will be averted.


