The Goodland High School boys basketball team finished sixth at the 19th annual Orange and Black Classic last weekend in Colby.

The Eagles of Colby High hosted the tournament with some games played in the school's gymnasium and some at Colby's Community Building. Goodland was one of eight teams from Kansas and Nebraska competing at the classic.

The Cowboys went 1-2 in the tournament. Goodland lost to the Redskins of Liberal 49-43 in the first round Thursday evening at Colby's Community Building. Friday evening the Cowboys defeated Scott City 66-41 in the first round of the consolation bracket. Goodland fell Saturday afternoon to the Tigers of Ulysses 80-54 in its final game of the tournament.

Liberal

Against Liberal on Thursday the two teams played even throughout the first period ending with the score tied at 14. Both teams went scoreless during the first two and a half minutes of the second period then the Redskins scored from beyond the three-point arc to take the lead 17-14. Liberal held the lead for most of the period, the Cowboys led briefly at 20-19, and took a 24-21 lead into the locker room at half-time.

In the third period Goodland closed to within a point of the Redskins four times, but Liberal scored the final six points of the quarter and held a 36-29 lead going into the final period. The Cowboys got no closer than five points in the fourth as Liberal responded each time Goodland scored and held on for the win 49-43.

Sophomore Bobby Miller led the Cowboys with 19 points, 12 of which came in the first half. Senior Lance Tedford and junior Derrick Raymer both scored seven points. Senior Jared Doke and junior Drew Wilkens added four points each, and sophomore Jace Herl had two.

"We just did not play well offensively," Coach Jon McLean said. "We turned the ball over too much and didn't shoot well. This game was disappointing because I really felt they were not better than. We did play pretty good defense."

Cowboy C team goes after fourth straight

The Goodland boys basketball C team won its third straight game Monday, Jan. 19 defeating the Tigers of Dundy County High School 64-32 in Benkelman, Neb.

The Cowboys are now 4-2 for the season. Their next action is at 4 this afternoon against the Blue Jays of Norton High at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Freshman Nick Angelos led the team in scoring, also for the third

Scott City

Against the Beavers of Scott City, the Cowboys scored the game's first seven points and kept the lead throughout the game. Goodland outscored the Beavers 17-14 in the first period and led 31-21 at half-time. The third period completely belonged to the Cowboys as they outscored Scott City 15-6 including the quarter's first 10 points and an exciting half-court three-point shot by Tedford to end the period that brought the Goodland fans to their feet.

The Cowboys kept the pressure on in the fourth by scoring the period's first eight points for a 54-27 lead. Goodland would stretch its lead to 28 points at one point in the period. Junior Lane Winter scored the final basket of the game to seal the victory for the Cowboys 66-41.

"Our best game to date," said McLean. "We passed the ball really well, and that got us a lot of easy shots. Our defense was really good also."

Miller lead with 23 points followed by Tedford with 14, including four of six from behind the three-point line. Raymer scored 10 points in the game, Herl added seven, and both Winter and Doke had four. Junior Wade Taylor scored two points, and Wilkens and junior David Livengood each scored on a free throw.

The Cowboys out rebounded Scott City 34-27 led by Raymer with six and Herl with five. Herl was the team's assist leader with 10.

"I hope our kids can learn from this game and see how well they can play," McLean said.

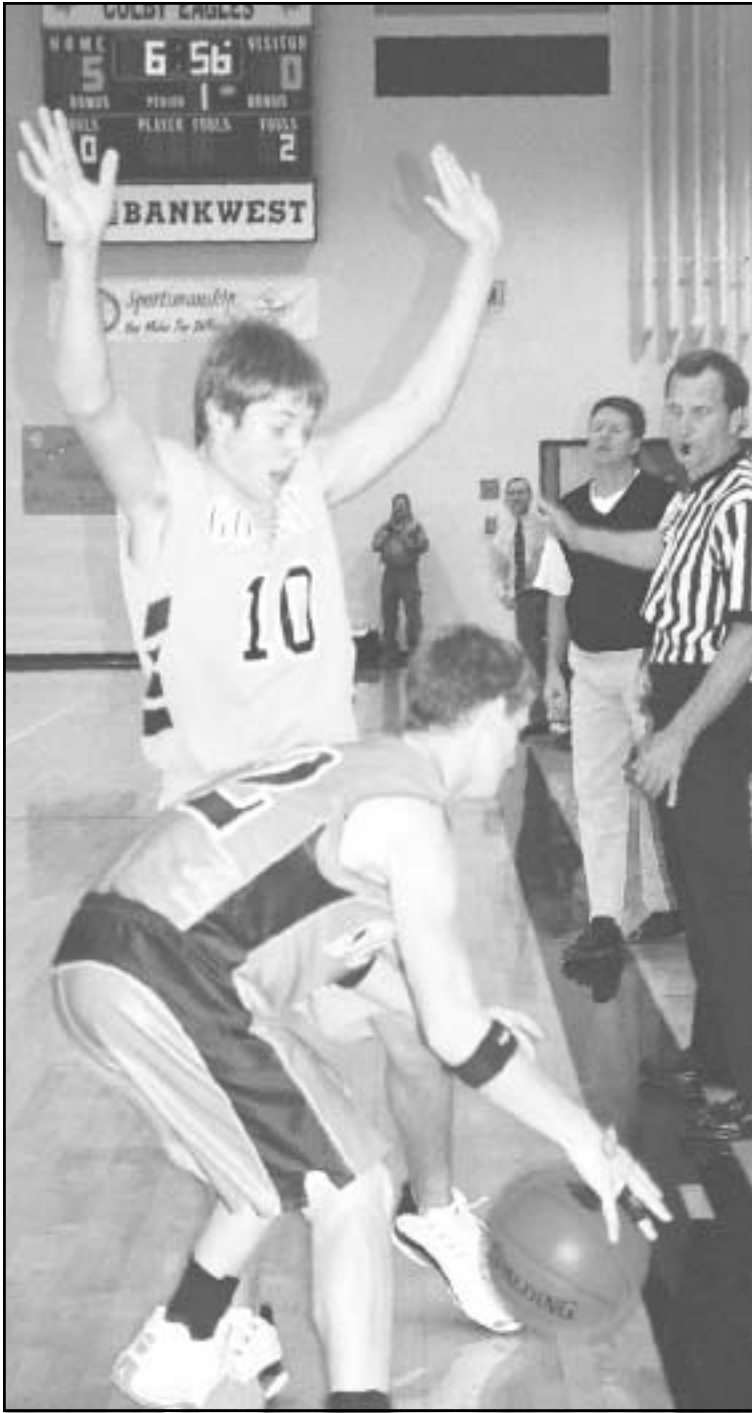
Ulysses

Early in the first period the Cowboys had a 5-4 lead, but that had evaporated and at the end of the quarter the Tigers led 20-16.

Late in the second quarter the Tigers had an 11 point lead, 40-29, but a basket by Taylor and two free throws by Miller cut it to a seven-point lead at half, 40-33.

In the third quarter the Cowboys tried to keep pace, but were outscored 19-11 to leave them down 59-44 heading into the final period.

The Tigers kept the pressure on in the fourth outscoring the Cowboys



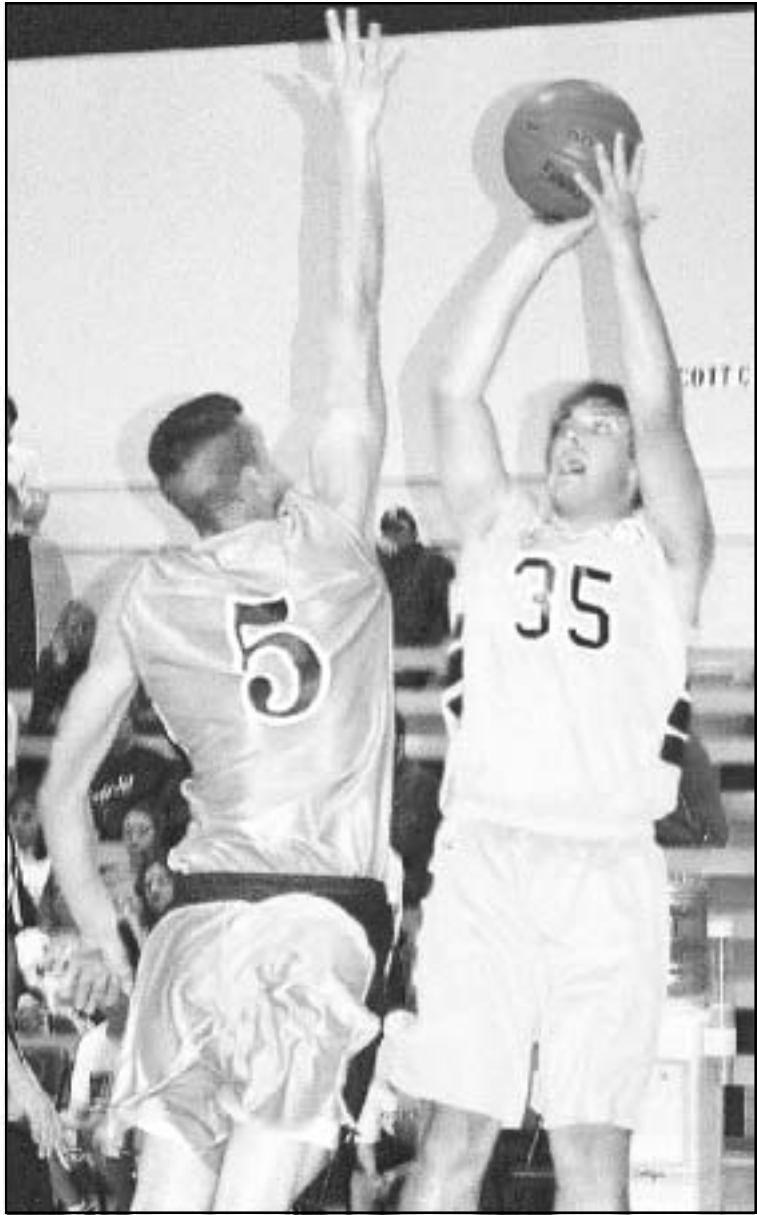
21-10 for the win, 80-54.

Raymer was the high scorer for the Cowboys with 16 on seven field goals and two free throws. Miller had 12 on three field goals and six free throws. Doke had 7 on two field goals and three free throws; Herl and Tedford each had 6 with all their points coming on 3-point baskets. Livengood had 5 on two field goals and one free throw, and Taylor had 2 on one field goal. Sophomore Wyatt Dautel had one steal and

missed his 3-point try. Wilkens had five rebounds and one steal, but did not take any shots. Winter had one steal in the game.

The Cowboys hit 35 percent from the floor (15/43), 36 percent of their 3-point shots (4/11) and 63 percent of their free throws (12/19). Ulysses out rebounded the Cowboys 39-34.

"We just did not play real well," McLean said, "especially on the defensive end. You cannot give up 80 points and expect to win.

"I want to compliment Ulysses on their play. They played an excellent game and shot the ball very well. They are a very deep, talented team and I hope to play them again during the Sub-State in March."

The Cowboys are now 4-6 for the season.

Miller was picked for the All-Tournament. McLean said he was pleased with the selection and that Miller deserved the honor.

The Titans of Wichita South High

won the tournament defeating McCook High School in the final 48-27. Liberal finished third and Ulysses fourth. The Colby Eagles, the host team, was fifth with Scott City seventh and Beloit eighth.

Goodland hosts the Blue Jays of Norton High School at Max Jones Fieldhouse today with C team action starting at 4 p.m. Friday the Cowboys and Cowgirls head to Oberlin to play the Red Devils of Decatur Community High School.


