



Student art on display in February

Hearts on strings dangle in the windows. Brightly colored footprints walk up the wall. Snowmen and penguins are clustered together on a snow-white table, and Egyptian coffins are laid out on another table.

The Carnegie Arts Center is adorned with the work of Goodland elementary students for the month of February.

Students from North, Central and West Elementary Schools and home-schooled students were invited to have their work displayed this month. The display includes a variety of projects, bright colors and even a kindergarten and first grade rendition of Peter Ilich Tchaikovsky's "Nutcracker Suite."

Students in Linda Lucas music class collaborated on a giant crayon interpretation of the famous ballet.

Sixth graders did self-portraits. Kindergartners made teddy bears with large hearts from construction paper and wall paper. Students from Nona Mason's early childhood class made snowmen and penguins from jars, Styrofoam, fabric, buttons and other materials.

Sixth graders in Mary Frazier's class made sarcophagi (coffins) from check boxes, clay and paint as part of their Ancient Egypt Study.

The students' work will be on display at the center until Sunday, Feb. 29, and can be seen during the center's regular hours, 10 a.m.-5 p.m. Tuesday-Friday and 1-4 p.m. Saturday, Sunday and Monday.




