The Goodland Star-News The Goodland High School wrestling team ended its home season Friday in dramatic fashion, overcoming a four-point deficit in the last match to whip St. Francis in a dual meet 33-31.

The Cowboys took a 6-0 lead after St. Francis forfeited the 103pound match to start the meet and built a 27-15 lead after 10 matches. However, the Indians won the next three by a fall, a major decision and a forfeit to move ahead 31-27 with one match left to wrestle.

Fortunately for the Cowboys, the final match was in the heavyweight class, where senior Jordan Bedore is the top-ranked wrestler in Class 4A. Undefeated this season, Bedore pinned his opponent in 13 seconds to give Goodland its eighth dual win for the season.

In a strategic move, Indians' coach Larry Gabel decided to forfeit the first match to the Cowboys

and move 103-pound wrestler Trevor Richard up to 112 pounds to face junior Chad Normandin. The move paid off, as Richard pinned Normandin 27 seconds into the third period to tie the team score at 6.

Normandin was leading 14-5 but made made a crucial mistake, said Cowboy coach Randy Bahe, which cost him the match.

Goodland regained a six-point lead, 12-6, when St. Francis forfeited the 119-pound match.

The next match featured junior Dexter Deeds of the Cowboys against the Indians' Dylan Lloyd at 125 pounds for the longest match of the meet. With the score tied at 4 after two periods, neither wrestler scored in the third, forcing a one-minute overtime.
