

Cowboys tame Broncos, win 77-53, now 7-9 on season

The Cowboys scored the game's first five points and never looked back as they defeated the Broncos of Lakin High School 77-53 Tuesday night at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Senior Jared Doke scored the Cowboys' first two points followed a few seconds later by a three-point basket by senior Lance Tedford to give Goodland a 5-0 lead. The Broncos scored the next four points to make it 5-4, which is the closest Lakin would get in the game.

The Cowboys next went on a 13-

2 point run to lead 18-6 after the first period. Goodland held Lakin scoreless for the first three minutes of the second quarter while increasing its lead to 25-6. The Cowboys went into the locker room at halftime leading 36-16.

Both teams scored four points to start the third period, but with the score 40-20 the Cowboys went on another 13-2 run to make the score 53-22. Lakin scored the last five points of the quarter to make it 53-27.

In the fourth period, the Broncos developed a hot hand and outscored

Goodland 26-24 but got no closer than 23 points in the quarter, as the Cowboys won their seventh game of the season 77-53.

Junior Derrick Raymer led Goodland with 25 points followed by Tedford with 17 and sophomore Jase Herl with 11. Juniors Jake Johnson and Wade Taylor both came off the bench to score five points. Doke scored four, juniors David Livengood and Lane Winter both had three, and sophomores Heath Chatfield and Wyatt Dautel each had two points.

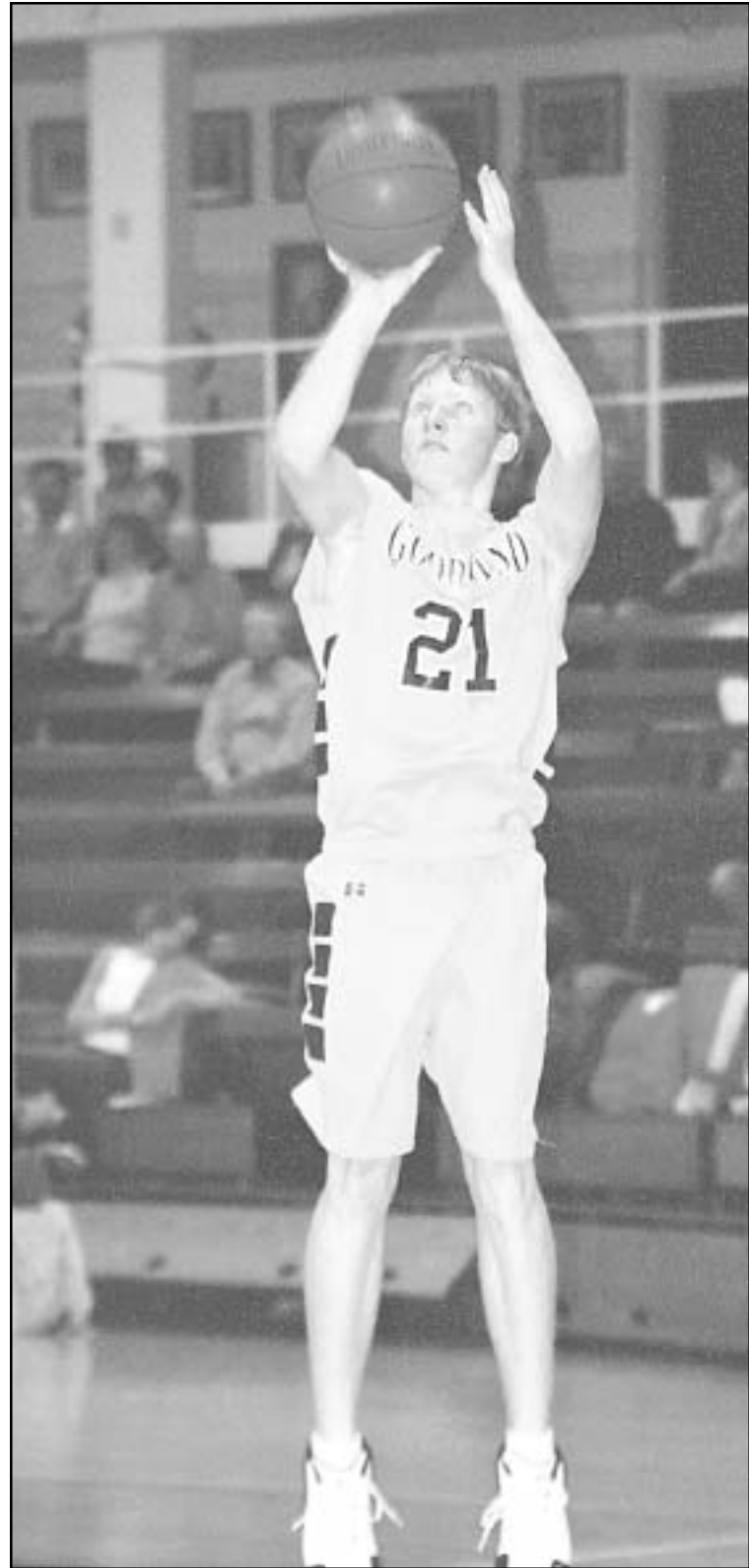
The Cowboys are 7-9 overall and

Goodland boys C team wins eighth straight

The Cowboy C team won its eighth straight game Tuesday night, defeating Lakin High School 56-40 at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

The freshman Broncos led 14-11 after the first period and stretched their lead to six, 26-20, at halftime. Goodland's defense held Lakin to just four points in the third period while the Cowboys scored 14 points to lead 34-30 going into the fourth quarter. Goodland outscored the Broncos 22-10 in the final period for

a convincing 56-40 win.

Freshman Taylor Frazier scored 13 points to lead the Cowboys, followed by freshmen Jerrod Goodman with 11 and Mikey Doll with 10. Freshmen Landon Williams and Nick Angelos both added eight points. Freshman Tyler Hilmer and Nathan Linin and sophomores Kalan Lambrecht each scored two.

Saturday, the Cowboys won the Golden Plains Junior Varsity Tournament in Rexford. Goodland de-

feated the Golden Plains junior varsity 58-56 in its first game at the round-robin tournament, then whipped Weskan's junior varsity 50-35 to earn the first-place plaque.

Williams led the Cowboys against Golden Plains with 21 points. Angelos scored 16, and both Lambrecht and Goodman had seven. Hilmer added three points, and Frazier and Doll both had two.

Against Weskan, Angelos scored 20 points to lead the team followed

by Goodman with 10 and Frazier with seven. Both Williams and Doll scored four points, Lambrecht three and Hilmer two.

On Jan. 30, the Cowboys defeated the Red Devils of Decatur Community High School 74-36 in Oberlin.

The C team is now 9-3 overall and 3-2 in the Northwest Kansas League. Tonight the team faces the Oakley Plainsmen at 3:45 p.m. at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

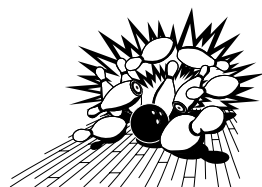
