Goodland boys improve to 8-9 Sophomore

The Goodland Star-News The Cowboys won their second straight game Friday night, 87-54 over the Plainsmen of Oakley High School at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Goodland defeated Lakin Tuesday 77-53. The Cowboys are 8-9 overall for the season and 3-3 in the Northwest Kansas League.

Junior Wade Taylor celebrated his first start of the season by scoring the game's first two points. After the Plainsmen tied the score at two, Goodland scored seven points to take a 9-2 lead.

At the end of the first period, the Cowboys led 27-11, and they took a 46-27 lead into the locker room at halftime. The Plainsmen scored the first two points of the second half, but Goodland scored the next 11 to increase its lead to 57-29. The third quarter ended with the Cowboys leading 72-44. Goodland kept its momentum in the fourth period, scoring the last nine points to make the final 87-54.

"A great game is all I can say," said Coach Jon McLean. "Our offense was really clicking. We had really good shot selection and made a high percentage. Our defense was pretty solid, and we rebounded the ball well, giving up only two offensive rebounds.

Senior Lance Tedford led Goodland with 18 points, including 12 from beyond three-point range, followed by junior Derrick Raymer with 16. Sophomore Jase Herl scored 15, and Taylor added 12.



Bobby Miller, in his first action since Jan. 24, came off the bench to score eight. Senior Jared Doke and jun-

ior Lane Win-Lane Winter ter both scored six points, junior David Livengood four and junior Drew Wilkens two. "Wade and Lane are really improving and playing well for us,"

McLean said. "They make us a much deeper team." Raymer led the team in rebounds

with 16. Herl was the Cowboys' assist leader with eight.

Raymer leads the team in scoring and rebounds. He has 232 points in 17 games this season, averaging over 13 points per game. He has 144 rebounds for an eight-per-game average.

Herlisthe Cowboys' assist leader with 102, averaging just under seven per game.

The Cowboys will be in Colby tonight for a rematch against the Eagles, who defeated Goodland 60-51 Jan. 9 at Max Jones Fieldhouse. The game will be broadcast on Goodland radio KLOE (730 AM) starting about 7:15 p.m. (Mountain Time), about 15 minutes after the end of the girls varsity game.

"I'm proud of our team," said McLean. "We can still improve. It should be an exciting finish to the season."
