Action continues Saturday with Round 5, the championship semi-finals, starting at 11 a.m. The championship finals will start around 6:30 p.m.

Goodland is sending 13 wrestlers to Abilene, five of whom are among the top six in their weight class in the latest rankings by the Kansas Wrestling Coaches Association:

• Senior Jordan Bedore is ranked No. 1 at heavyweight with a 24-0

• Freshman Brett Bahe is ranked No. 2 at 103 pounds and has a 26-2 record.

• His brother, senior Blayze Bahe at 119 pounds ranked No. 3 with a 28-1 record.

• Junior Dexter Deeds at 125 pounds also is ranked No. 3 at 17-9 for the season.

• Junior Brandon Cowan is ranked No. 5 at 23-9.

overhaul that engine last year....

"I am concerned about this as we get closer to summer. We have no idea how long the repairs to Engine 8 will take, and we could be in serious trouble if we were to lose Engine 11. We would not be able to handle the power load for the city if something should happen to our seven-mile transmission line."

Commissioner Dave Daniels asked what other power plants are doing.

Pickman said several power plants have replaced engines recently at a cost of about \$7 million for the entire plant.

"What about alternatives like wind power?" Daniels asked.

"We have been told that wind power in this area is about 30 percent efficient," Pickman said. "That means you have a good supply for 30 percent of the time.

"We are looking at all options. This is vital to us.'

At the airport, Pickman said the city has been told is should pass a height restriction zoning ordinance, which is allowed under Kansas law.

This would restrict the height of



buildings and towers within 10,000 feet of the airport runways. A proposed communications tower might cause problems, he said.

'As to the tower that is being proposed, the first look by the Federal Aviation Administration turned it down, but the project was reviewed again and the permit was allowed," Pickman said. "We have protested the location, but have not heard a final determination. This would not be a question is we had the zoning ordinance in place.

"The federal people keep saying it is up to the city to protect the air space around the airport, and there are legal means to handle this.

"We need to address it now rather than later. If we do not do this properly, we could be in violation of the federal regulations, and a court could decide we would have to pay to have the object moved or torn down."

Commissioner Chuck Lutters, acting as mayor in the absence of Rick Billinger, said it would be a good idea to explain to the county commissioners what action the city is considering, since it was a subject at the recent joint meeting.
