

The Goodland High Cowboys led after three of the four periods in their game against the Eagles on Tuesday at the Colby Community Building, but not the one that meant most. They lost, 62-56.

The loss stopped Goodland's three-game win streak and dropped the team's overall record to 8-10. The Cowboys, 3-3 in the Northwest Kansas League, will travel to Hoxie today to face the Indians in their last regular league game of the season with the tipoff about 7:30 p.m. (Mountain Time). Hoxie is also 3-3 in the league and 11-8 overall after defeating Norton on Tuesday, 52-43.

In the first period against Colby, junior Derrick Raymer scored the game's first points, giving the Cowboys a 2-0 lead. The Eagles responded with eight straight, but senior Lance Tedford hit a three-point basket, then scored on a layup a few seconds later to make it 8-7.

A free throw by Raymer tied the score at 8, then junior Wade Taylor scored a basket to give the Cowboys

a 10-8 lead. Colby scored the next four points to retake the lead, but with a minute left, Tedford hit his second three-pointer to give Goodland a 13-12 lead at the end of the opening period.

The Cowboys opened the second quarter by scoring seven straight points to increase their lead to 20-12. The Eagles fought back to within two at 22-20, but Goodland scored nine straight points to end the half and take a 31-20 lead into the locker room.

The teams played even through the first half of the third quarter, but with the score 41-29 Colby scored six straight. After a basket by Taylor made it 43-35, the Eagles scored seven straight to end the period with the Cowboys leading 43-42.

Colby scored on a three-point play to take its first lead of the second half 45-43. From then on, Goodland managed to tie the score four times but never regained the lead. With about a minute left, Raymer hit two free throws to get within two at 58-56. The Cowboys

were forced to foul to stop the clock and preserve time, but the Eagles had the double-bonus and hit all four of their free throws during the final 25 seconds to win 62-56.

Raymer scored 19 points to lead the Cowboys with Tedford right behind with 18, including 12 from three-point range. Taylor, in his second start of the season, scored eight. Senior Jared Duke added six points, sophomore Jase Herl three and junior Lane Winter had two.

Goodland's last regular season game is Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse against Hugoton High School of the Hi-Plains League. Tip-off will be about 7:30 p.m., about 20 minutes after the girl's varsity game.

Senior Lance Tedford (No. 25) shot over two Eagle defenders Tuesday night at the Colby Community Building. Tedford was the Cowboys' second leading scorer with 18.

Freshman Nick Angelos, who

was held scoreless in the first quarter, scored 18 points to lead Goodland. Freshmen Landon Williams and Jerrod Goodman scored seven and six points respectively. Freshman Tyler Hillmer added three, and both freshmen Mikey Doll and Taylor Frazier had two.

The C team will travel to Benkelman, Neb., on Saturday.
