June Faulkner

June A. Faulkner, 87, a Wallace County homemaker, died Tuesday, Feb. 17, 2003, at Greeley County Hospital in Tribune.

She was born April 17, 1916, in Russell County, the fourth of 11 children of Bertha (Ringisen) and James Harbaugh. She attended country school on Big Creek in Russell County and graduated from Russell High School in 1934.

Following graduation, she moved to Wallace County to teach at Dover School. On Jan. 19, 1935, she married Ed Radiel in Russell. During this time, she was an active member of the Weskan Methodist Church and the Sand Creek Unit of the Dover Grange, and she served as a 4-H leader and a Sunday School teacher.

In April 1962, Mr. Radiel died, and she moved to Salina. On July 2, 1966, she married Awin Faulkner. They moved to Cañon City, Colo., to take care of her dad. They lived

there 18 years before moving back to Oakley in 1990. In 1999, they moved to Sharon Springs.

Faulkner loved her family and was proud of each of them. She loved to spend time with her grandchildren. She was known for her personality and sense of humor, even up to the end.

She was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and American Legion auxiliaries and a board member of the Northwest Kansas Area Agency on Aging. She stayed active in the community and church until entering Prairie Manor Good Samaritan Center.

Preceding her in death were her parents; both husbands; five brothers, Ernest, Richard, James, Ralph and Lloyd Harbaugh; daughters, Ruth Cochrane and Carol Vernon; and a great-grandson, Garrett Mote.

Survivors include two sons, Dale (Joyce) Radiel of Sharon Springs and Dick Radiel of Salina; a stepdaughter, Carol (Randy) Meathrell of Granada Hills, Calif.; two broth-

ers, Pete Harbaugh of Russell and Warren Harbaugh of Great Bend; three sisters, Phyliss Bodine of Russell, Jean Livingston of Great Bend and Bonnie (Aubrey) Schurtz of Hutchinson; 15 grandchildren; 34 great-grandchildren; and four great-great-grandchildren.

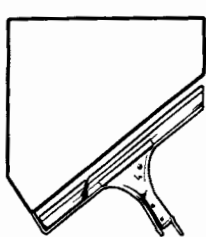

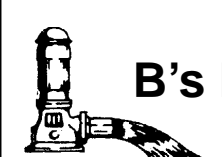
