"We're looking forward to playing Hugoton again," Coach Terry Daise said. "We have had a good week of practice, working hard on defensive intensity. We hope to have better execution, and more patience, on offense."

Freshman Whitney Archer is second in scoring with 243 points, a 12point-per-game average. She is third in rebounds with 80. Junior Justeen Koehler is second in rebounds with 95 and third in scoring with 144.

Seven Cowgirls have seen action
