



Former Cowgirl leads Colby

The Colby Community College women's basketball team finished its regular season 27-3 overall and a share of first place in the West Division of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference.

The Colby women and Seward County Community College both had a 14-2 record.

The Lady Trojans, ranked No. 8 in the final National Junior College

Athletic Association Division I poll last Tuesday, defeated Pratt Community College 85-79 Saturday in Pratt. Colby led 50-41 at halftime and did not trail in the second half.

Freshman Jayci Stone, a former Cowgirls standout, scored a career-high 25 points to lead the Trojans. Stone hit eight of nine field goal attempts, including five of six from behind the three-point arc, and grabbed five rebounds.

Sophomore Bojana Samardziska led the team in rebounds with 10 and was second in scoring with 18. Sophomores Louise McLean and

Jelena Spiric each added 12 points, and sophomore Ivana Drmanac scored 11.

The Lady Trojans defeated the Lady Conquistadors of Dodge City Community College 86-65 in their final home game last Wednesday, Saturday, Feb. 21, the Lady Trojans defeated Hutchinson Community College 56-44 in Colby.

Three conference teams are among the top 25, led by Seward County Community College at No. 4 with a 27-3 overall record. Cloud County Community College is ranked No. 22 at 24-6. All three are in the West Division. Coffeyville

Community College, of the East Division, and Dodge City also received votes in the final poll.

Both of Colby's conference losses were to Seward County, at home 89-76 in overtime on Jan. 14 and 85-77 on Feb. 11 in Liberal. Because of these wins, the Lady Saints earned a higher seed in the regional tournament, which starts today.

Colby will host Allen County Community College in the first round 7 p.m. (Central Time) Wednesday at the Colby Community Building.

The regional tournament's championship rounds will take place March 6-9 at the Bicentennial Center in Salina.

Brewster girls take second at regional tournament

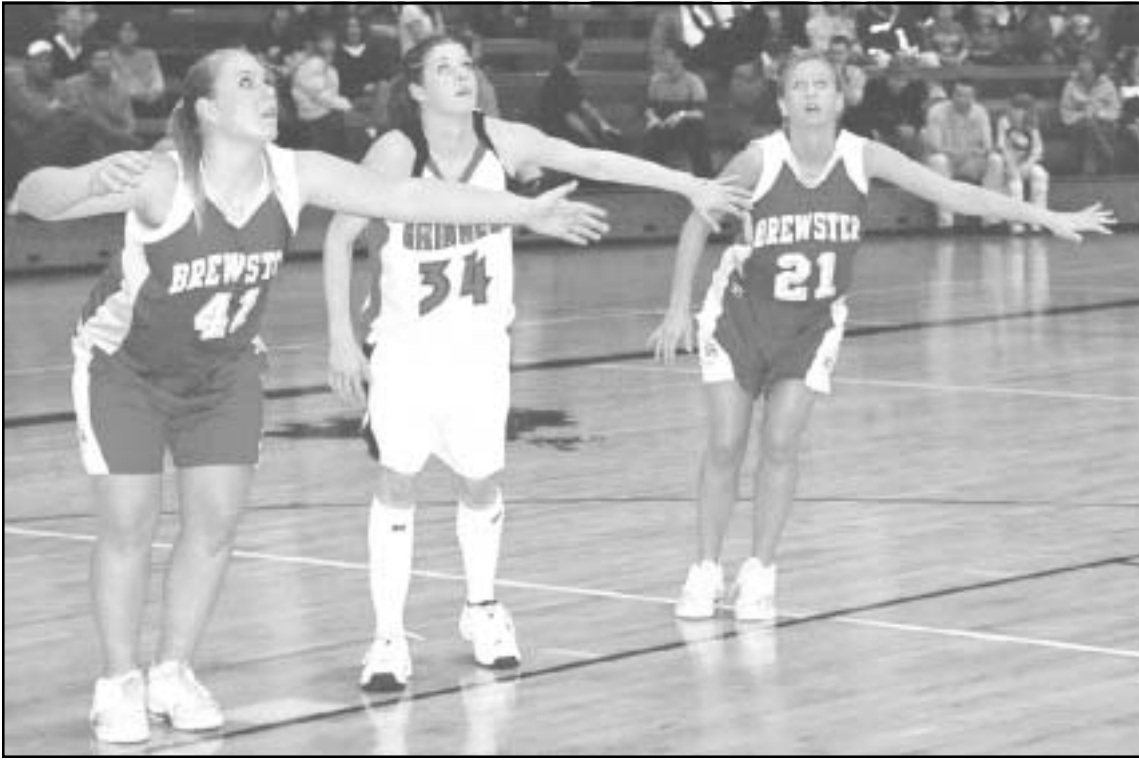
The Lady Bulldogs of Brewster High School lost 73-70 to the Grinnell Lady Warriors in the title game of the Class 1A regional basketball tournament Saturday at Max Jones Fieldhouse.

Brewster jumped out to a 4-0 lead, but the Warriors fought back to tie the game at six. The teams played even throughout the rest of the first period, which ended with the score tied at 13.

Grinnell scored the first five points of the second period and later held a seven-point lead, 25-18. However, the Bulldogs went on a 7-0 point run to tie it up again at 25. A free throw by the Warriors in the final seconds gave Grinnell the lead a halftime 26-25.

There were five lead changes in the third period, and neither team got more than four points ahead. With the Warriors leading 49-47, Brewster sophomore Jayln Reid hit a three-pointer at the buzzer from just inside the half court line to put the Bulldogs up 50-49.

The seesaw battle continued in the fourth period. Trailing 67-66 and with clock running out, Brewster was forced to foul to save time. Grinnell had the double-bonus, and the Bulldogs sent senior Kayla Beckman to the free throw line three

times in the final seconds. Beckman was perfect, hitting all six shots, and although Brewster was able to score a basket after her first two trips to the charity stripe, time ran out after the third and the Warriors won 73-70.

Brewster was led by Reid with 28 points. Both junior Andrea Horney and freshman Avery Schulz scored 13 points, sophomore Amy Carpenter added six, freshman Sarah Flanders five, sophomore Caitlan Rush three, and freshman Megan

Allen two.

The Lady Bulldogs are now 18-4 and will face Greeley County

High School of Tribune on Saturday at the substate tournament at Russell High School. Tribune defeated Healy 58-35 Saturday to win its regional in Sharon Springs. The top two teams from each regional Class 1A tournament move on to substate.

The Brewster boys' team finished its season 10-12 after losing to Prairie Heights High School of Jennings 63-62 in their semifinal game Thursday.

After the girls championship game Saturday, the Beavers of Herndon defeated Jennings 66-56 for the boys regional championship. The Beavers trailed after the first two periods, but fought back to tie the score at 42 at the end of the third.

Herndon then outscored the Coyotes 24-14 in the fourth to win the game 66-56. Senior Lance Basgall of Herndon led all scorers with 21 points. This is the last season for the Beavers as Rawlins County High School will close in May.

The Herndon boys, now 22-1, and the Grinnell girls, 18-2, advance to the substate tournament Saturday, hosted by Triplains High School of Winona at the Colby Community Building.

Cowboy C team finishes 12-6

The Goodland High School boys' C team finished its basketball season Feb. 21 with a 12-6 overall record, including an 11-game win streak.

"We made quite a bit of improvement throughout the season," Coach Don Smith said. "We only had a couple of games where we were not competitive."

Smith said despite ending with three losses, the team had a season to be proud of.

The young Cowboys were 1-3 in their first four games. They defeated Decatur Community High School of Oberlin 72-46 Jan. 12 to start their streak. It ended with a 57-

38 loss at Colby Feb. 17.

Goodland closed out its season with a pair of losses on Feb. 21 at a junior varsity tournament in Benkelman, Neb., first losing to Culbertson High 43-37 then to Dund County 35-34.

Against Culbertson, the Cowboys were led by freshmen Landon Williams with 14 points. Freshmen Jerrod Goodman scored 11, Mikey Doll six and Taylor Frazier three. Sophomore Kalan Lambrecht added two points and freshman Nick Angelos scored on a free throw.

Both Williams and Goodman scored seven points to lead the team against Dund County. Doll and Angelos each added six, and Lambrecht and Linin both had three. Frazier scored two.

Smith said he enjoyed coaching the team and all the players will contribute to the Cowboys' basketball program over the next two to three seasons.

"I hope the players keep their interest in basketball and work on their skills over the summer," the coach said.
