wrestling team placed third at the near fall to increase his lead to 8-3. Class 4A state tournament in Wichita this weekend, with three Cowboys bringing home gold medals.

Seniors Blayze Bahe and Jordan Bedore and junior Dexter Deeds won their weight classes by taking four straight matches.

At 119 pounds, Bahe quickly won his first two matches, pinning Robert Lopez of Chapman in 33 seconds, then pinning Jake Dozier of Pratt in 48 seconds. In the semifinal match, Bahe bested Columbus' Ross Devoe in a 4-3 decision. Bahe faced Tanner Dawson of Abilene in the finals pinning him 47 seconds into the second period.

Deeds won his first match at 125 pounds by pinning Scott City's Tanner Stucky in 59 seconds. In the quarterfinals, Deeds pinned Aaron Ellis of Columbus with just 25 seconds left in the third period. Deeds won a 4-2 decision over Judd Schroeder of Andale in their semifinal match, then defeated Joey Ortiz of Ulysses 5-4 in the championship.

In the first round of the heavyweight competition, Bedore pinned Prairie View's Darrell Limzey with just a second left in the first period. Next Bedore pinned Steve Stewart of Andale in 54 seconds. In the semifinals, Bedore won a 7-2 decision over Tad Greer of El Dorado to set up the much-anticipated final against Ulysses' Tony Lewis.

Bedore took a 2-0 lead in the first period with a takedown, but Lewis scored on an escape to make it 2-1, which is how the first period ended. Bedore had the top position in the second period, but could not make much progress. The referee called a stalemate with 40 seconds left. Starting again from the down position, Lewis scored a reversal with 15 seconds left and held a 3-2 lead after two periods.

Bedore started the third period in the down position and 30 seconds later escaped to tie the score at 3. Twenty-two seconds later, he scor-

The Goodland High School Bedore scored three points with a Lewis fought back and scored on a reversal late in the match to make the final score 8-5.

> This was the fourth time the two wrestlers met this season, with Bedore winning them all. Bedore was the only one to defeat Lewis this season.

Freshman Brett Bahe finished fourth at 103 pounds, defeating Dustin Bowen of Rose Hill 7-2 in the first round, then Scott City's Nicholas Keough 12-0 in the quarterfinals. Bahe lost a 3-0 decision to Chet Mercer of Columbus in their semifinal match.

In the consolation bracket, Brett defeated Colby's Daniel Tibbles 5-1 to advance to the third-place match. There he lost to Josh Hinman of Parsons 8-5.

Junior Chad Normandin, at 112 pounds, lost his first round match 6-2 to Zach Davis of Basehor-Linwood, then lost in the consolation bracket to Josh Sharp of Fort Scott

At 140 pounds, junior Blake Saint was pinned by Osawatomie's Clay Page in the first round then lost to Scott City's Rees McKinney by major decision 11-0 in the consolation bracket.

In the first round, at 189 pounds, junior Brandon Cowan lost to Ryan Seger of Ulysses 5-3, then to Lansing's Ryan Civils in the consolation bracket by major decision 14-0.

Scott City won the team title with 109 points, although only one of its wrestlers made it to the title round. The Beavers had 12 wrestlers at the tournament. The state runner-up was Abilene, the defending state champion, with 99.5 points. Goodland earned 93 points.
