# stor-news sports Hugoton downs Cowgirls again

The Goodland Star-News The Cowgirls ended their basketball season with a 53-48 loss to the Lady Eagles of Hugoton on Monday at Max Jones Fieldhouse in the first round of the Class 4A substate tournament

This was the second time in 10 days that Hugoton had defeated the Cowgirls on their home court. The Lady Eagles whipped Goodland 70-50 on Feb. 21 to end the Cowgirls regular season.

As they had the earlier game, Hugoton used a long scoring run to start the third period to build a lead the Cowgirls could not overcome. The Eagles led at halftime 24-23, then scored 10 straight points to open the second half. They kept the Cowgirls scoreless until, with less than three minutes left in the quarter, freshman Dani Bedore sank a free throw.

Twice in the fourth quarter, the Cowgirls closed to within two, but with the score 43-40 Hugoton went on a 10-3 scoring run to give the Eagles the lead 53-43 with less than points in the final 13 seconds to close to 53-48.

Bedore scored the game's first two points as Goodland took a 6-3 lead early in the first period. Hugoton scored the next six to lead 9-6. With the score 11-8, the Cowgirls made a six-point run of their own, retaking the lead 14-11. Again the Eagles came back, and the period ended with the score tied at 15.

Neither team could score in the first minute of the second quarter. Freshman Whitney Archer injured her right ankle while fouling a

of the half. Hugoton scored on one of the resulting free throws to take the lead 16-15. Sophomore Justeen Koehler scored a basket to give Goodland a 17-16 lead.

Hugoton scored next, regaining the lead at 18-17, then increased it to 20-17. Koehler then scored four straight points to give the Cowgirls their final lead of the game, 21-20. Four straight points by the Eagles made it 24-21 and another basket by Koehler made it 24-23 going into the locker room at halftime. Koehler scored all eight of the Cowgirls' points in the second period.

The Eagles held Goodland scoreless for over five minutes to open the third quarter, while scoring 10 points of their own to stretch their lead to 11 at 34-23. Bedore's free throw at 2:47 left in the third got Goodland back on the scoring track and the Cowgirls were able to get within eight, 38-30, by the end of the quarter.

The Cowgirls opened the fourth period with a 8-2 scoring run to narrow Hugoton's lead to 40-38. However, Goodland could not get any a minute left. Goodland scored five closer. After the Cowgirls got within two again, at  $4\overline{4}$ -42, the Eagles scored nine of the next ten points to make it 53-43.
