

Eagles end Cowboys' season, 53-51

Goodland led most of the night, but that didn't stop archrival Colby from stealing the lead in the fourth quarter, ending the Cowboys' year with a 8-13 record.

Colby team defeated Goodland 53-51 Tuesday night at the Colby Community Building in the first round, knocking the Cowboys out of the Class 4A substate tournament.

The Cowboys led 14-8 after the first period, 29-19 at halftime and 42-32 at the end of the third. Then the Eagles opened the fourth quarter with a 15-2 point run to take a 47-44 lead with about two minutes left.

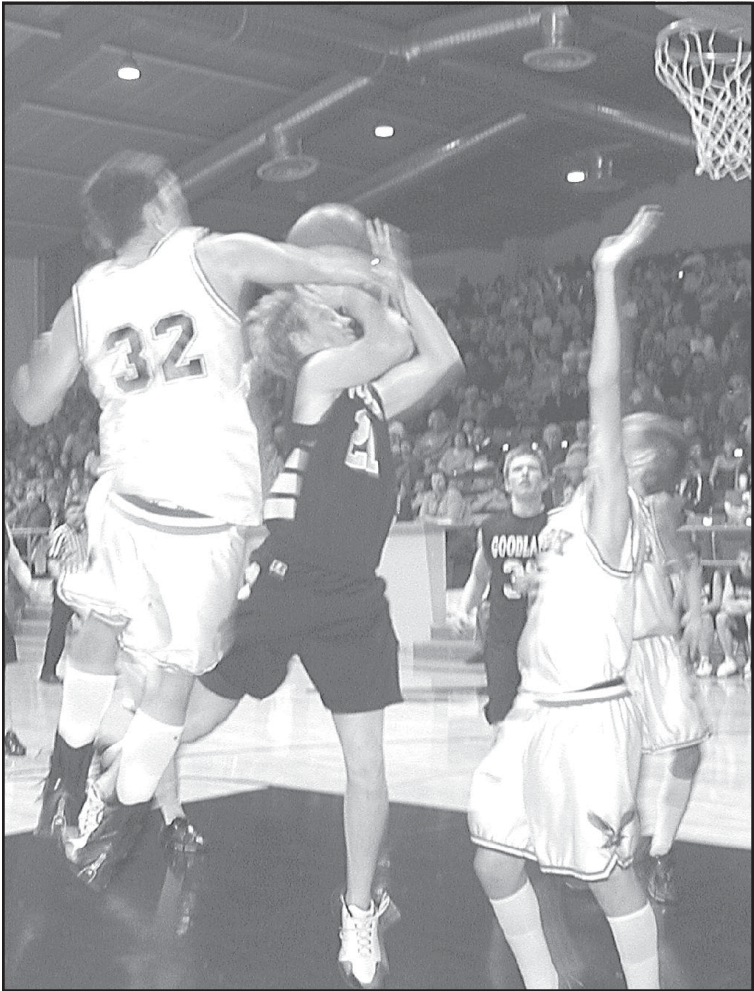
Senior Lance Tedford hit a basket from behind the three-point line to tie the game at 47. A few seconds later Colby regained the lead 49-47, but soon after Tedford hit his second three-pointer to give Goodland back the lead 50-49.

The Eagles went ahead 51-50 with less than a minute left. Colby fouled junior Derrick Raymer, sending him to the free throw line for two shots with five seconds on the clock. He hit the first to tie the score, but missed the second. Colby immediately called a timeout to discuss strategy. That seemed to work, as the Eagles' junior Matt Augustine scored a basket at the buzzer to snare a 53-51 victory.

Colby defeated the Cowboys all three times the teams met this season. The Eagles won 60-51 on Jan. 9 at Max Jones Fieldhouse and 62-56 on Feb. 17 in Colby.

Tuesday, the Eagles took the first lead 2-0 to start the game. After the teams tied the score at 2, 4, 6 and 8 points, the Cowboys scored six straight to make it 14-8 at the end of the first period.

Goodland led throughout the second quarter, although twice Colby got within one point, at 16-15 and 18-17. Sophomore Jase Herl was fouled making a basket, and with the free throw extended Goodland's lead to 21-17. After an Eagle basket made it 21-19. The Cowboys scored eight straight points to close the first
