

# Colby loses to Dodge City in regional quarterfinals

The Colby Community College women ran out of gas Monday night, ending their season with a loss to the Lady Conquistadors of Dodge City Community College 63-56 in the semifinals of the Region VI tournament.

This was the third meeting between the two teams this season, with Colby winning the first two, 70-68 on Jan. 28 in Dodge City and 86-65 Feb. 25 in Colby.

After leading 33-30 at halftime,

Dodge City outscored the Lady Trojans 14-8 to widen its lead to nine points, 47-38. The Colby offense then came alive, scoring 14 straight points to take a 52-47 lead with a little over five minutes left in the game.

The Conquistadors responded with five straight to tie the score at 52. Later, with the score tied at 56, Dodge City sophomore Ronnie Maglaughlin hit a three-pointer with less than a minute on the clock

to give the Conquistadors the lead, 59-56. Dodge City scored four more points in the final seconds, while keeping Colby scoreless, to win 63-56.

Colby sophomore Bojanna Samardziska scored 27 points to lead all scorers, including 10 straight during the Trojans' 14-point run. Sophomore Louise McLean added 17 points and led the team in assists with five. Goodland's Jayci Stone scored five points, sophomore

Ivana Drmanac four and sophomore Jelena Spirac three.

Dodge City outrebounded Colby 52-41. Samardziska and Spirac had eight rebounds each to lead the Trojans.

Colby coach Tom Stephens said his team gave up too many offensive rebounds and had trouble putting the ball in the basket. The Trojans hit on only three of 22 shots from three-point range.

Adding to Colby's problems was

the loss of Spirac to a knee injury with less than six minutes left in the game. She was the Trojans' second leading scorer for the season, averaging over 16 points per game.

The Trojans finished their season 29-4 and were the West Division co-champions in the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. Colby was ranked No. 8 in the final National Junior College Athletic Association poll.

Four Colby players have com-

mitted to the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Drmanac, McLean, Samardziska and Spirac will be playing for the Cornhuskers next season.

Dodge City lost to Seward County Community College 64-38 in the regional championship game Tuesday. Seward County advances to the national tournament March 16-20 at the Bicentennial Center in Salina.

### Former Cowgirl ends collegiate career on high note

Former Cowgirl Lana Enfield played her last college game last Saturday, but it was a big one as the Lady Crusaders of Manhattan Christian College played for the National Christian College Athletic Association championship.

The Lady Knights of Kentucky Christian College, the defending national champions, defeated Manhattan Christian 63-55, ending their season 31-5.

Enfield, a senior majoring in family life ministry, is only the second player in the past eight years to letter in all four of her seasons, the last two as a team captain. She was named one of five scholar athletes on the team.

"Lana has been a tremendous part of the success of our program over the last four years," said Coach Scott McFall. "Her role on the team has changed over the years from a starter in her freshman and junior seasons to a backup as a sophomore and senior. The great thing about Lana is her willingness to accept her role and continue to work hard and have a great attitude."

Enfield scored 535 points in four years, grabbed 410 rebounds, had 151 assists and 104 steals. She played in 28 games this season, one as a starter, scored 74 points, had 29

assists, 20 steals, 52 rebounds and two blocked shots.

"I have been extremely blessed to have Lana on my team these last four years," McFall said. "We will miss her leadership and heart."

### Lady Trojans get first win of season

The Colby Community College softball team defeated Garden City Community College 2-0 for its first win of the season Wednesday in the opening game of a doubleheader.

The Lady Broncbusters City came back in the second game to win 7-2. Former Cowgirl Alissa Shields hit a triple during her only trip to the plate, batting in both Lady Trojan runs.

"We are starting to play better," Coach Carl Adams said. "We hit the ball hard all day, but it was right at people. Our defense needs to continue to get better and the pitching more consistent."

The Trojans hit a busy part of the schedule, playing at least two games a day for four straight days all on the road, which was to start Thursday with a doubleheader at Butler County Community College in El Dorado. Today they take on the Lady Pirates of Independence Community College.

Colby will be in Tulsa, Okla., Saturday and Sunday to compete in the Midwest Classic Tournament.

## Brewster falls to Tipton 41-35

The Lady Bulldogs of Brewster High School let a slim lead slip Saturday, losing to the Lady Cardinals of Tipton High School 41-35 in the final minutes of the Class 1A substate championship in Russell.

Tipton outscored the Bulldogs 10-7 in the first period, but Brewster took a slight edge in the second quarter to get within two points, 15-13, at halftime. The Bulldogs' momentum carried through the third period, as they outscored the Cardinals 13-10 to take a 26-25 lead going into the fourth. There Tipton showed why it is undefeated by outscoring Brewster 16-9 to win 41-

35. That ended the Brewster season.

Sophomore Jalyn Reid led the Bulldogs with 14 points, followed by freshman Megan Allen with eight. Freshman Avery Schulz scored six points, sophomore Caitlan Rush five and freshman Audrey Hoyt had two.

Brewster advanced to the substate title game by defeating Greeley County High School of Tribune 55-49 last Friday in the semifinals. Schulz led the team with 14 points. Rush scored 10, Reid nine, sophomore Amy Carpenter eight and Allen six. Both Hoyt and junior Andrea Horney scored three points

and freshman Sarah Flanders had two.

The Bulldogs finished their season with a 20-5 record.

Tipton, now 24-0, advanced to the state tournament at Gross Coliseum on the campus of Fort Hays State University. The Cardinals, the No. 1 seed, were to face B&B High School of Baileyville, the eighth seed, in the quarterfinals Thursday. The semifinals will be played today and the championship game at 4 p.m. (Central Time) Saturday.
