## University seeks gifted students for scholar weekends next month

The University of Kansas is looking for 100 gifted Kansas students in grades 8-12 to attend Duke University Talent Identification Program Scholar Weekends next month in Lawrence.

The programs, set for the last two weekends in April, will offer intensive courses taught by KU faculty and graduate instructors. These will challenge students while allowing them to get a taste of university life.

The Scholar Weekends are available to any Kansas student who has been identified as gifted or talented by his or her school or has participated in Duke's Talent Identification Program.

Each student will choose one course: for the weekend of April 17-18, Introduction to Psychology, Aerospace Engineering or Math-

ematics through the Ages; or for April 24-25: Film Criticism and Analysis, Architecture or Working Across Cultures.

The participants will arrive on campus Saturday morning; take part in classes all day Saturday; spend the night in the Lawrence Holiday Inn Holidome, supervised by resident counselors; and return to campus Sunday for a full day.

Classes will be in Fraser Hall, KU's signature building on the top of Mount Oread. The cost for each weekend is \$350 with lodging or \$300 without.

# Display gives 'silent witness'

Three organizations and a university have brought the Silent Witness exhibit to western Kansas to boost awareness of domestic violence.

The Northwest Kansas Family Shelter, Fort Hays State University, Decatur County Stand Against Violence and Logan County Stand Against Violence are co-sponsoring the Kansas Silent Witness Exhibit.

The exhibit consists of 12 red, life-sized silhouettes of Kansas victims. The individual story of how each life ended at the hands of her husband, ex-husband or partner is printed on the silhouettes.

The exhibit will be on display through Friday in the Memorial Union at Fort Hays State University, then at the Hays City Library on Saturday and Sunday.

From there, the display will go to Oberlin, where it will be on display next Monday-Wednesday at the old Duckwall's building. It will then be on display Thursday, March 25, at Oakley High School.

The goals of the exhibit are remembrance, to honor the women who were murdered in acts of domestic violence; awareness, to raise the awareness of the extent of domestic violence; advocacy, to help connect the public with resources for ending the violence in their lives; and legislative, to encourage community and legislative action to end the violence.

The idea of having an exhibit recognizing victims of domestic violence began with a group of women artists in Minnesota. The Minnesota

Women's Consortium began work on a state exhibit in 1992, and by the end of the year had 27 silhouettes.

Kansas began work on the present exhibit in 1997. It was developed by the Greater Kansas City Section of the National Council of Jewish Women, SAFEHOME, Johnson County's Domestic Violence Shelter program, and the Kansas Coalition Against Sexual and Domestic Violence.

The exhibit was introduced to the state on Jan. 27, 1998, at a dedication by Attorney General Carla Stovall in the Rotunda of the Capitol. Sponsors decided on an exhibit of 12 silhouettes on which names will change during the years. All 50 states now have Silent Witness exhibits.
