Three Cowgirls make all-league

Three Cowgirls basketball play- Hugoton 53-48 on March 1. ers received all-league honors from the Northwest Kansas League for their performance this winter.

Dani Bedore was the only freshman among the 11 players named to the All-League team. Bedore was the Cowgirls' leading scorer, finishing the season with 345 points, more than 16 points per game. She was also led in rebounds with 116.

Senior Jessica Osborn and freshman Whitney Archer both received honorable mentions for the allleague team. Osborn was fourth on the Cowgirls' scoring list with 142 points. She led the team with 90 assists and 50 steals. Osborn scored 12 points for the "Light Jerseys" at the Sports Shoppe/Colby Bowl All-Star Classic on Sunday.

Archer was second on the Goodland team in scoring with 249 points. She was the Cowgirls' best free throw shooter, for those with 40 or more attempts for the season, hitting 33 of 44 for 75 percent. Archer also was second in blocked shots (14) and steals (40).
