How can we make friends by 'unrighteous' riches?

When Jesus advised his disciples at Luke 16:9: "Also, I say to you, make friends for yourselves by means of the unrighteous riches, so that, when such fail, they may receive you into the everlasting dwelling places," some may wonder why Jesus' followers would have anything unrighteous. Others may wonder if he suggested buying friend-

What are the unrighteous riches? How can Christians make friends by means of them? And what does that have to do with "everlasting dwelling places?"

The unrighteous riches are what they sound like, money, material possessions, physical things. Why are they unrighteous?

Consider the example of the nation of Israel. When God miraculously delivered them from Egypt,

At Luke 21:1-4, Jesus pointed out a widow who dropped two small coins into the treasury chests at the temple. He said she gave more than the rich because she gave all she had, rather than out of her surplus.

This shows that God and Jesus value donations of all sizes that are given eagerly by those who want to do all they can. So having an abundance materially is not required to gain their friendship.

Among the ways we can make friends by means of the unrighteous riches is to donate our time and money to help to accomplish God's work. Jesus said at Matthew 24:14, "And this good news of the kingdom will be preached in all the inhabited earth for a witness to all the nations; and then the end will come."

Do we help with preaching the good news of the kingdom? When we donate, does the money go toward preaching that message or to the LORD...."

Another way we can make friends by means of the unrighteous riches is to help ones in need as the Apostle Paul urged Christians at 2 Corinthians 8:14: "but that by means of an equalizing your surplus just now might offset their deficiency, in order that their surplus might also come to offset your deficiency, that an equalizing might take place."

How does this help us make friends with God and with Jesus? Proverbs 19:17 tells us: "He who is kind to the poor lends to the LORD, and he will repay him for his deed."

Why is the way we use our resources so important?

Jesus said in Luke 16, quoted above, that the riches would fail and that those we make friends with would receive us into "everlasting dwelling places."

Ezekiel 7:19 tells us of the time when riches will fail: "They cast their silver into the streets, and their gold is like an unclean thing; their silver and gold are not able to deliver them in the day of the wrath of

The day of God's wrath is described in the book of Revelation. Chapter 21:1-5 tells us what will follow that "day": "Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more.

"And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride adorned for her husband; and I heard a great voice from the throne saying, 'Behold, the dwelling of God is with men. He will dwell with them, and they shall be his people, and God himself will be with them; he will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning nor crying nor pain any more, for the former things have passed away.'And he who sat on the throne said, 'Behold, I make all things new."

We can be received into everlasting dwelling in that new heaven or new earth only if we have made wise use of our time and money to preach God's kingdom and teach others about it and to help those less fortunate than ourselves.
