# The Rev. John Bowman

The Rev. John Bowman, 79, a longtime missionary in Japan and former Goodland resident, died Monday, March 22, 2004, at the City Hospital in Ogaki, Japan.

He was born Nov. 6, 1924, near Goodland, the son of Nelson and Mabel (Charles) Bowman, and attended school in Goodland.

During and shortly after high school, he worked on the Herman and Freda Darnauer farm. He signed up for military service during World War II and served in in New Guinea, the Philippines, and occupied Japan with Company D, 80th Infantry.

At the end of his service in Japan, he felt God's call, through a group of children, to enter mission work. On Aug. 13, 1950, he married
