For the girls, senior Jessica Osborn won the shot put with a throw of 34 feet .25 inches and the javelin with a throw of 111 feet 5 inches.

Four Cowgirls and a relay team finished second. Freshman Kaylee Billinger took second in the 100meter and 200-meter dashes. Freshman Dani Bedore was second in the long jump and triple jump, and also placed fifth in the 200-meter dash.

Freshman Emily Murray finished second in the 300-meter low hurdles and ran the 100-meter high hurdles. Sophomore Lisha Tedford was second, behind Osborn, in the shot put.

The team of Bedore, Murray, Billinger and junior Kara Angelos was second in the 4x100-meter relay, finishing in 53.78 seconds. Angelos finished third in the 100meter high hurdles and fifth in the 300-meter low hurdles.

Other Cowgirls earning points Friday were freshman Whitney Dautel, who finished third in the 3200-meter run and fourth in the 1600-meter run, and sophomore 3.200 meters.
