Senator found guilty, was fined, imprisoned and ousted

**April 4, 1904:** Senator Burton Found Guilty — Convicted of Violating Federal Statutes as Senator — Penalty is Fine, Imprisonment and Forfeiture of Office — Joseph Ralph Burton, United States Senator from Kansas, was convicted in the United States district court in St. Louis on the charge of having accepted compensation to protect the interests of the Rialto Grain and Securities company before the post office department.

The jury deliberated 41 hours. The penalty for the crime of which Senator Burton is convicted is a fine

of not more than \$10,000 and imprisonment for not more than two years.

Also, the fact is that he is forever prohibited from holding any office of honor, trust or profit under the United States government, which means the forfeiture of his office as United States senator.

**April 5, 1904:** Big Prairie Fire — Large Territory Burned Over in Wallace and Logan Counties — A prairie fire started south of the Smoky, on the line of Logan and

Wallace counties, and nearly four miles south of the Sherman county line.

It is estimated that 65,000 acres were burned, and large amounts of hay were burned up.

It is supposed that the fire was started by a steam thrasher going over the country toward Winona.

M.L. Chandler and others living on the southeast line of this county put out 17 miles of the north line of the fire, working from 3

o'clock in the afternoon until 3 o'clock the following morning.

At first the wind was from the south, but later it swung around and blew from the north, and the fire was driven as far as the Union Pacific railroad. The fire was plainly visible from Goodland.

**April 6, 1904:** Rain Fell Sunday — After a long stretch of dry weather, a welcome rain fell Sunday forenoon. Not a great amount fell, but it did much good and may be the beginning of a favorable season.

**April 7, 1904:** Sale of Stamps — Postmaster Stevens reports that the stamp sales at the Goodland post

office have been large the last twelve months, the total receipts for the fiscal year ending March 31 being \$3,600.

**April 8, 1904:** A prairie fire was started by lightning on the Carter-Anderson ranch and burned over about a section of land before the falling rain distinguished it. This makes three sections of this ranch in the southeast corner of the county burned over this spring.
