

Businessmen win Basketball Madness

A town business team defeated “GHS Faculty Plus” 58-54 at the Basketball Madness game Tuesday night in Max Jones Fieldhouse organized by the Goodland Music Boosters.

The game followed a soup supper, with both raising money for the Goodland School District’s music program for scholarships, equipment, travel costs and other expenses.

The business team lead through most of the game until with about 2 1/2 minutes left the faculty took the lead 54-53 on a three-point basket by Jeff McCall. Unfortunately, those were the last points scored by the teachers.

The businessmen regained the lead 55-54 on a pair of free throws by car dealer Danny Archer. The businessmen scored three more points on free throws, to make the final score 58-54.

Both teams apparently decided to start the game by demonstrating their ball-handling skills to the crowd, as neither team scored for nearly three minutes. Then Jason Hickson broke the drought with a basket to give the businessmen a 2-

0 lead. Brady Stindt tied the game with a pair of free throws. Cliff Leach hit a three-pointer to regain the lead for the businessmen as they went on to score 10 of the next 12 points and lead 15-4 at the end of the

quarter.

The teams again put on a ball-handling demonstration, lasting almost two minutes, to start the second period. It was highlighted by a pass by the businessmen to one of

the referees. The faculty’s Brett Flanders decided enough was enough and scored a basket, followed by a three-point basket by Jon McLean to close the faculty to within six points, 15-9.

With the businessmen leading 19-14, another long scoring drought appeared as the ball changed possession 14 times before Archer scored his second basket of the game. The teams crawled into the locker room at half time with the businessmen leading 24-18.

The third period proved to be a different story, as both teams scored over 20 points. After the businessmen scored the opening basket of the half, the faculty scored eight straight to tie the score at 26. A three-point basket by Steve Jimenez regained the lead for the businessmen.

A short time later, another three-pointer by Jimenez made the score 35-30, after which Sid Unruh of the businessmen did a Bobby Knight and threw a chair out onto the court. The referees called a double technical foul and Flanders sunk all four free throws to close within one at 35-34.

Unruh was counseled by Steve Evert, whose looming presence calmed the situation.

Getting possession after the technical, the faculty got its first lead of the game 37-35 on McLean’s third basket from behind the three-point line. Jimenez tied the score back up at 37, after which the businessmen outscored the faculty 9-4 to lead 46-41 at the end of three.

John Dautel scored for the businessmen on a breakaway steal to open the fourth period. Later, another three-pointer by McLean made it 53-51, after which McCall gave the faculty its second, and last, lead 54-53.

The game suffered a short delay in the fourth quarter when a mysterious bag lady wandered onto the court and disrupted the flow of the game.

Jimenez led all scorers in the game with 18 points, including nine from three-point range. McLean scored 16 for the faculty. Other players in double figures were Hickson with 15 and Flanders with 10.

Other businessmen who scored were Archer with seven points, Leach with five, Danny Whalen with four and Jay Herl with three. Jay Jolly, Josh Dechant and Dautel each scored two. Travis Daise and

entertained before and during the game. Les Chantes sang the National Anthem and the X-pressos gave a half-time show

Also at half time, two basketballs were raffled off and Carol Jolly, president of the boosters, thanked everyone for their support of the fund raiser and gave a brief explanation where the money was going.


Connie Grieve presented the “expensive and prestigious” trophy to the businessmen.




