The Goodland Star-News The Cowgirls softball team evened its record at 3-3 Friday afternoon at Centennial Park by sweeping both games of a doubleheader against the Lady Bulldogs of Syracuse High School.

Goodland won both games in five innings, because of the "10 after five" rule, taking the first 22-0 and the second 12-1. The Cowgirls scored at least two runs in each of their nine times at bat.

In the first game, the Cowgirls scored five runs in the first inning, four in the second, six in the third and seven in the fourth. Goodland's turn at bat in the fifth inning was not needed.

Sophomore Chelsea Gray led the Cowgirls at the plate getting four hits out five plate appearances. She scored three runs. Three other Cowgirls went two of three at the plate.

Senior pitcher Lauren Gray had arough first inning, but good defensive play by her teammates kept the Bulldogs from scoring even though they had runners on second and third with only one out. After the first, only four Syracuse players reached base and three of them were later tagged out, either caught stealing or caught off base.

Gray pitched all five innings to earn her second win. She gave up son. just two hits, struck out three and walked one. Gray is 2-1 for the sea-
