

Cowgirls stampede Lady Bulldogs

The Cowgirls softball team evened its record at 3-3 Friday afternoon at Centennial Park by sweeping both games of a doubleheader against the Lady Bulldogs of Syracuse High School.

Goodland won both games in five innings, because of the "10 after five" rule, taking the first 22-0 and the second 12-1. The Cowgirls scored at least two runs in each of their nine times at bat.

In the first game, the Cowgirls scored five runs in the first inning, four in the second, six in the third and seven in the fourth. Goodland's turn at bat in the fifth inning was not needed.

Sophomore Chelsea Gray led the Cowgirls at the plate getting four hits out five plate appearances. She scored three runs. Three other Cowgirls went two of three at the plate.

Senior pitcher Lauren Gray had a rough first inning, but good defensive play by her teammates kept the Bulldogs from scoring even though they had runners on second and third with only one out. After the first, only four Syracuse players reached base and three of them were later tagged out, either caught stealing or caught off base.

Gray pitched all five innings to earn her second win. She gave up just two hits, struck out three and walked one. Gray is 2-1 for the season.

The Bulldogs were more competitive in the second game, scoring

a run in the top of the first inning, but Goodland responded with three runs in the bottom of the inning.

Solid pitching by senior Deanna Thompson and stingy Cowgirls defense kept Syracuse scoreless for

the rest of the game.

Goodland's offense, however continued to score, adding three

runs in the second inning, two in the third and in the fourth. Leading 10-1 in the bottom of the fifth, Thompson hit a triple that drove in two runs. That made the score 12-1, ending the game.

Sophomore Melissa Swager led Goodland at the plate in the second game getting hits all three times at bat, two of her hits were doubles. She drove in three runs and scored two runs. Thompson and freshman Whitney Archer both had triples.

Thompson earned her first win of the season, pitching all five innings, giving up four hits, striking out 10 and giving up just one walk.

"Both pitchers did a great job," Coach Terry Daise said. "We take on Hays next and they'll be our toughest test of the season. They have two really fine pitchers in the Herl sisters."

Senior Anna Herl was 3-0 and her twin sister Emily Herl 2-1 for the season as of last Thursday. The Lady Indians were 5-1 overall going into the weekend.

The Cowgirls are in action again today at Centennial Park for both varsity and junior varsity teams against Hays High School starting at 3 p.m. Both teams play again Friday when Goodland hosts Colby High School, same time and place.

The junior varsity, under coach Ryan Scheopner, is 4-0 for the season and has outscored its opponents 74-14.

Cowboy all-star plays against Jayhawk team

Cowboy senior Lance Tedford will play for the Northwest Kansas All-Star Team at 5:30 p.m. (Central Time) Saturday against the University of Kansas Barnstorming Tour Team at the Grinnell High School gym.

Tedford is one of 15 high school seniors from the 16-county area of northwest Kansas asked to play on the all-star team. The selection committee chose from nominations submitted by 30 area high school coaches. Each coach was asked to nominate five players they saw play this past season and who they felt could play at the collegiate level next season.

Tedford was the Cowboys' second-leading scorer, averaging nearly 13 points per game, and was the team's leading three-point shooter, hitting on 53 of 115 attempts. He was one of only two players to start every game for Goodland.

Tedford was picked for the Northwest Kansas League All-

League team and was chosen to play for the "Dark Jerseys" in the Sports Shoppe/Colby Bowl All-Star Classic last month. He scored nine points all from three-point range. Tedford was a Class 4A honorable mention on the PrepZone All-Class List compiled by *The Topeka Capital-Journal*.

Tedford was one of six Cowboy basketball players named to the league's all-academic team. He will play for MidAmerica Nazarene University in Olathe next season.

Other players from the Northwest Kansas League on the all-star team


are Shane Stover of Colby, James Newman of Hoxie, Egan Grafel of Oberlin, Cody Sattler of Oakley, and Sage Hemmert and Trevor Blackwell of Quinter. Coaching the high school team will be John Crist and Brian Roesch of Quinter.

The all-star players will receive a game uniform provided by Grinnell Locker and a shooting shirt provided by Mickey Weiser Insurance Agency. They will be treated to a pregame lunch and a postgame dinner, with their parents, courtesy of Ostmeyer Farms.

The KU Barnstorming Team is made up of current Jayhawk seniors and former players. An autograph session will start at 6:30 p.m., and fans must have a paid ticket to get an autograph. T-Shirts and other Jayhawk memorabilia will be on sale.
