Named to the boys basketball all-academic team were seniors Jared

Doke and Lance Tedford, and juniors David Livengood, Derrick Raymer and Drew Wilkens.

Cowgirls making the team for basketball include seniors Cortney Schields and Megan Leonard; sophomores Lisha Tedford, Justeen Koehler and Melissa Swager; and freshmen Emily Murray and Kaylee Billinger.

'Kit Carson' to visit Colby on Friday

Kit Carson will visit Colby Community College on Friday during the Thomas County Historical Society's annual meeting, which starts at 6:30 p.m. (Mountain Time) in the student union.

Actually, Frederick Krebs, a history professor at Johnson County Community College, portrays the famous frontier scout as part of the History Alive Program of the Kansas Humanities Council.

Carson, a prominent figure in western folklore, was a trapper,

rancher, soldier, scout and Indian agent. Although he traveled throughout the West, he based himself in New Mexico. During the Civil War, Carson organized the New Mexico volunteer infantry, which saw action at the battle of Valverde.

After the war, Carson moved to Colorado, where he died in 1868. In 1942, Camp Carson, located south of Colorado Springs, was activated and named in his honor. In August 1954, the post was designated as

Fort Carson, and it remains in important Army post today.

Krebs, who has portrayed Kansas newspaper publisher William Allen White in the past, will portray Stephen Douglas in the Kansas Chautauqua, "Bleeding Kansas,

Where the Civil War Began," at the Prairie Museum of Art and History in Colby June 11-15.

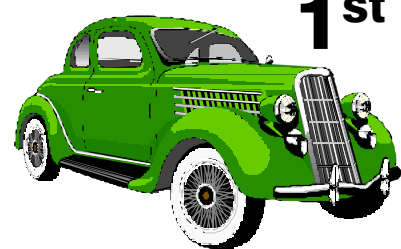
