Lady Indians rough up Cowgirls

In a battle between Cowgirls and Indians, the Hays High School softball team swept a doubleheader against Goodland on Tuesday at Centennial Park, winning both games 10-0 in five innings.

In the first game, the Lady Indians scored four runs to open the game and kept the pressure on throughout. Hays added a run in the second and scored three more in the

third. The Goodland defense held the Indians scoreless in the fourth, but Hays scored two in the fifth for a 10-0 lead going into the bottom of the inning. The Cowgirls went "three and out" and the game was over due to the "10-after-five" rule.

Hays senior pitcher Anna Herl faced 16 batters in five innings, striking out nine while giving up just two hits.

"In the first game," Coach Terry Daise said, "we got off to a bad start and couldn't recover."

Senior Cortney Shields hit a double in the second inning for the Cowgirls and senior Jennifer Mentzer got a single in the third. Senior

Lauren Gray's pitching record drops to 2-2 after giving up 10 hits and walking six. She had one strikeout.

Things seemed to get a little better for the Cowgirls in the second game, as Hays took a 1-0 lead after one inning. The Indians did not score in the second, but tallied runs in both the third and fourth innings. The floodgates opened in the fifth, as Hays scored seven runs to again post a 10-0 lead going into the bottom of the fifth.

The Indians continued to hold Goodland scoreless and Hays won its second shortened game.

"In the second game, we played well until the fifth inning," Daise said. "We just made too many mistakes, and you can't do that against a good team."

Sophomore Melissa Swager hit a single in the second inning and Shields hit one in the fifth as the Cowgirls again got just two hits. Senior pitcher Deanna Thompson picked up her third loss, striking out three while giving up eight hits and walking three.

The Cowgirls varsity and junior varsity, which also lost both games Tuesday, play again this afternoon at Centennial Park starting at 3 p.m. Both teams will play a doubleheader against the Lady Eagles of Colby High School.

Cowboys, Cowgirls both finish fourth at track meet in Scott City

The Cowboys and Cowgirls track and field teams both finished fourth out of seven teams at the 69th annual Scott City Invitational on Tuesday.

Goodland had one double winner: senior Espirion "Speedy" Aguilar won the 1,600-meter run in 4 minutes, 43.18 seconds and the 3,200 meters in 10 minutes 50.12 seconds.

Senior Lance Tedford won the long jump with a leap of 20 feet, 7 inches. He placed fifth in the triple jump at 39 feet 4.25 inches.

Senior Dan Melia won the 110-meter high hurdles in 15.7 seconds,

finished second in the pole vault clearing 11 feet 6 inches and was third in the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in 43.91 seconds.

Senior Jessica Osborn was the only first-place finisher for the Cowgirls, winning the javelin with a throw of 104 feet 2 inches. She placed second in the shot put at 32 feet 6.75 inches.

Other Cowboys earning team points include junior Bret Jarmin, who placed third in the 100-meter dash in 11.38 seconds, third in the javelin with a throw of 164 feet 8 inches and fifth

in the long jump at 19 feet, 1.75 inches. Senior Jordan Bedore placed third in the shot put with a heave of 43 feet 8 inches and was fourth in the discus at 142 feet 4 inches.

Freshman Kerek Mason placed third in the 1,600-meter run in 5 minutes, 3.76 seconds. Senior Josef Felver was fourth in the 100-meter dash in 11.4 seconds and fifth in the 200-meter dash in 24.25. Senior Jared Doke was fourth in the long jump at 19 feet 5 inches. Doke was sixth in the triple jump at 38 feet 10 inches and sixth in the 400-meter run in 56.75 seconds.

Sophomore Cory Yarbrough was fifth in the high jump, clearing 5 feet 4 inches, and senior Dustin Baker put

the shot 42 feet 3 inches for fifth place.

The Cowboys' 4x100-meter relay team of Felver, Doke, Tedford and Jarmin placed third in 45.34 seconds.

The Tigers of Ulysses High School won the boys title with 137 points, followed by Oakley with 114. The host Scott City was third with 109 points. Goodland finished with 108. The other schools, in order of finish, were Larned, Lakin and Colby.

Other top Cowgirl finishers were freshman Kaylee Billinger, sophomore Lisha Tedford, junior Kara Angelos, freshman Emily Murray,

freshman Stephanie Sheldon, sophomore Tiffany Thomas and sophomore Janelle Wolak.

Billinger placed second in the 100-meter dash in 12.99 seconds and the 200-meter dash in 27.84 seconds. Lisha Tedford was second in the discus with a toss of 93 feet 1 inch and third in the shot put at 30 feet 7.5 inches.

Angelos was third in the 100-meter high hurdles in 16.63 seconds and fourth in the 300-meter low hurdles in 52.74 seconds. Murray was third at 300 meters in 51.27 seconds and fourth at 100 meters in 16.85.

Sheldon finished fifth in the pole vault, clearing 6 feet 6 inches. Thomas was sixth in the 3,200-meter run in 14 minutes 6.63 seconds and Wolak was sixth in the javelin with a throw of 74 feet 8 inches.

The Lady Eagles of Colby won the girls' competition with 134.5 points, followed by Scott City with 119. Lakin High School was third with 93 points. Goodland scored 76. Oakley was fifth, Larned sixth and Ulysses seventh.

Both teams are in action again today, at 1 p.m. (Mountain Time) in Holcomb. Goodland will hold the annual Tri-State Relays next Friday.

Outlaws get first win of season

The Goodland Outlaws baseball team won its first game of the season Monday, defeating Oakley 11-4 in the second game of their doubleheader at Centennial Park. Oakley won the first game 7-2.

The win left the Outlaws 1-3 for the season. The team will travel to Ellis on Monday for a doubleheader starting at 2 p.m. (Mountain Time).

In the first game Monday, Oakley scored seven runs on five hits, including two doubles, and committed no errors. Goodland scored two runs on three hits, one a triple, and had four errors.

Outlaw pitcher Brandon Zelfer picked up the loss in his first game of the season.

In the second game, both teams scored a run in the first inning. Oakley broke the tie in the top of the second with a run and increased its lead to 3-1 with another run in the top of the third. However, the Outlaws scored eight runs in the bottom of the third to take the lead, 9-3. Both teams scored two more runs in subsequent innings to make the final tally 11-5.

Oakley scored five runs on six hits and committed three errors. Goodland scored 11 runs on five hits, including a home run by Zelfer, and also committed three errors.

Outlaw pitcher Wyatt Dautel won his first decision of the season.

The Outlaws were swept in their season opener last Friday by the Colby High School junior varsity at Centennial Park, losing the first game 17-7 and the second 10-8.

In the first game, Colby scored 17 runs on 14 hits and committed two errors. Goodland scored seven runs on six hits and had two errors. Outlaw pitcher Andrew Pettibone picked up the loss.

In the second game, the Eagles took a 3-0 lead in the top of the first

inning, but the Outlaws scored five runs in the bottom of the second to go up 5-3. Colby scored a run in the third, then scored two more in the top of the fourth to regain the lead 6-5. Goodland responded with three runs in the bottom of the inning to take back the lead 8-6.

Colby's held Goodland scoreless in the last three innings while scoring a run in the fifth and three more in the seventh to win 10-8.

Outlaw pitcher Tadd Taylor got the loss, giving up 10 runs on five hits and seven walks. Goodland scored eight runs on three hits, including a double by Dautel, and committed two errors.
