Goodland awaited long-distance phones today in history

April 27, 1904 Toll Line For Goodland — Goodland is getting so skittish that mail and railroads can't hold her. Long distance phones are bound to come, and a good eye can almost see the poles looming in the east. The Central State Telephone Company of Oberlin representative was in Goodland for the purpose of looking at the best town in northwest Kansas with a view of building a toll line from Colby here. He says their company is surely coming our way, and the line that is to reach Goodland is building west as far Selden, and will never stop until it plants its poles in Sherman county soil. Our county has been

out of the back woods since the dawn of time, and as soon as all our telephone lines are completed we will also be out of the short grass country. Communication centralizes and puts our latch strings close at the hand of our eastern neighbors. Then they will think more of us and not talk grasshoppers and short grass any more in connection with western Kansas.

April 28, 1904 Shipped in Full Blood Shorthorn — A registered Shorthorn bull was shipped here to William Richardson last week from

Sabetha, Kan. As Mr. Richardson, who lives in Grant township, has sickness in his family, he has been unable to come to town and the animal is being kept temporarily by Mr. McCoy in Calvert's corral. The animal cost \$100, and the freight was \$17.85. He is a dark red, two years old in August and weighs more than 1,200 pounds.

April 29, 1904 Tuesday was pay day for the employes of the Rock Island. The pay roll for the month of March amounted to about \$27,000.

April 30, 1904 Notice to Clean Up — Notice is hereby given to all householders of the city of Goodland to clean up all yards and outhouses of all decaying material dangerous to public health. A.C. Gulick, Health Officer
