He said he's excited to be coming to Colby and is looking forward to new challenges.

He and his wife Rhonda have three children, 17-year-old Jeremy who will be a freshman at Northeastern Junior College in Sterling, Colo., this fall; 16-year-old Jada who will be a high school sophomore and 14-year-old Zack who starts eighth grade this fall.

Koenig said Rhonda is a senior vice president in charge of compliance at First National Bank in Las Animas.

He didn't play sports in school but he's always had the interest and was happy he got the chance to start as a coach in Las Animas. He also enjoyed working under Mark Bliss who is getting ready to leave coaching in Conway Springs for a job in Florida.

Koenig is looking forward to meeting and working with the faculty, students and said the community appears to be "successful and progressive."

'Our family's excited about the move," he said.
