

Cowboys finish fifth at Scott City

59 players from eight schools compete at junior varsity tournament at Sugar Hills

Last week was a busy one for the golf team, as the Cowboys shot rounds in three varsity tournaments and a junior varsity meet in four day days.

Last Tuesday, the varsity played at Scott City, where it finished fifth out of eight teams. Junior Brandon Cowan finished seventh overall with an 84. Wade Taylor was next for the Cowboys, shooting an 87, and junior Dexter Deeds was just one stroke back at 88. Sophomore Daniel Schields shot a 94 and sophomore Brandon Tatman 109.

The Tigers of Ulysses won the team competition with a score of 331. Scott City's Blue squad was second with 335 and Atwood was third with 340. Leoti High School finished fourth with 356 and Goodland was one stroke behind with 357.

Andy Fikan of Atwood was the individual champion, shooting a round of 71, two strokes better than David Heyd of Scott City.

Also last Tuesday, Goodland hosted a junior varsity tournament at Sugar Hills Golf Club with 59 players from eight schools. It was played on the course's back nine.

Goodland coach J.D. Hooper said the tournament was put together to give younger players a chance who otherwise would get little or no tournament time during the season. Some of the players were girls from schools that do not have a separate golf program for them.

Freshman Jacob Erickson led the Cowboys with an 11-over-par 47 and finished in a five-way tie for first place. Senior David Griffith finished in a three-way tie for third with 49.

Junior Richard Bauman finished with a 51 and freshman Brandon



Douglas had a 52. Other Cowboys in the tournament were freshman Ryan Gausman (55), freshman Mikey Doll (59), sophomore Matt Rohr (62), junior Brady Nelson (66), freshman Taylor Frazier (68) and freshman Doug Eddleman (70).

On April 19, the varsity competed at the Bob Barker Hays High Invi-

tational at the Smoky Hill Golf Course in Hays. The Cowboys placed second behind Thomas More Prep-Marian High in Division II play.

Freshman Nathan Linin finished in a tie for third place with Brenden Gross of Thomas More at 85. Rounding out the top scorers for

Goodland were senior Preston Lambrecht with 88, junior Derrick Raymer with 94 and sophomore Brett Lalicker with 96.

Also competing with the varsity in Hays were junior David Liven-good, who shot 101, and Cowan at 102.

The Cowboys were third at the

Oberlin Invitational Tournament on April 17 at the Oberlin County Club. Raymer placed fourth overall with a round of 79. Douglas was next with a 92. Both Lalicker and Lambrecht shot 95. Also playing with the varsity in Oberlin were junior Brock Lohr with 100 and Erickson at 106.

Colby High won the tournament with a score of 330, and Atwood was second with 347. Goodland's score was 361. Host Decatur Community High School was fourth with 363.

The varsity and junior varsity will be in action again today at the Hoxie Golf Course. Tee off is 3 p.m. (Central Time). The junior varsity will play at the Oakley Country Club at 3 p.m. Friday (Central Time).

Trojans split baseball doubleheader with Dodge City

The Colby Community College baseball team split a doubleheader against Dodge City on Sunday, winning the first game 8-7 and losing the second 17-4.

In the first match, Dodge City was leading the Trojans 5-0 going into the bottom of the third inning when freshman outfielder Mike Neuberg hit a grand-slam home run over the center-field fence to make it 5-4.

The Broncbusters held that lead until the bottom of the sixth, when Colby tied the score on a Dodge

City fielding error. With runners on first and second, Neuberg came to the plate and hit a double down the right field line. That gave the Trojans a 7-5 lead. Later in the inning, sophomore catcher Kyle Sandusky hit a double that scored Neuberg to make it 8-5.

Dodge City scored two in the top of the seventh to make the final 8-7.

Neuberg went three for four at the plate, hitting two doubles along with his grand slam, and drove in six runs. Sandusky went four for four including two doubles and a run

batted in. Freshman Travis Hearne pitched four and a third innings for the win.

Despite hitting three home runs in the second game, Colby got a scoring lesson from the Broncbusters. Dodge City led 4-2 going into the bottom of the third, when solo home runs by sophomores Cole Armstrong and Joel Gould tied the score at 4.

The Broncbusters then scored 13 runs in the next four innings while holding the Trojans scoreless for a 17-4 win.

Armstrong and Gould both went two for three at the plate, each getting a home run and a double. Sandusky had a solo home run in the second inning.

Last Wednesday, Colby swept a doubleheader against Brown Mackie College at home in Colby, winning the first game 3-2 and the second 3-0. The series was highlighted by sophomore Brian Hassing's two-run homer in the fifth inning of game two.

On April 17, the Trojans swept both games of a doubleheader

against Dodge City, winning 10-6 and 16-5. On April 18, Colby lost to Butler County 5-0. The second game was suspended.

The Trojans are now 22-22 overall and 12-11 in the West Division of the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference. They play McCook Community College in a non-conference doubleheader at home today at 1 p.m. (Central Time). The team travels to Great Bend on Wednesday for a conference doubleheader against Barton County Community College.
