Colby paper reported on 'sister city'

Sherman County Historical Society
May 7, 1904: Speaking Of Goodland (*Colby Free Press*) — We made a quick trip to Goodland Monday.

Our sister city is putting on a good deal of style these days.

Over fifty residences have been built in the last year, which would indicate a very healthy growth.

We found the Stewart boys of the *Republic* busy at work. The boys get out a fine paper, but their advertising columns show that the merchants are slow to appreciate their labors for the town and community.

May 8, 1904: Hack Line — T.C.

Duell will run hack to and from all trains and about the city, also do transfer work and deliver express packages. Your patronage solicited. Leave orders at Brick Hotel, phone 150. T.C. Duell

May 9, 1904: H.N. Schell Is Out — The Once City Marshall of Goodland Restored to Citizenship — H.N. Schell, who shot and killed William Frazer, a railroad fireman, March 18, 1902, was pardoned last week by Governor Bailey.

Schell was sentenced in September 1902 to serve two years in the

Kansas penitentiary, and as his term, deducting exemption, would be out in June, he was pardoned before his sentence ran out, which restores him to citizenship.

Almost everybody in Sherman county is acquainted with the facts of the Schell case.

Schell's downfall happened when he, as city marshal of Goodland, was attempting to quiet a disturbance on Boulevard.

William Frazer, a railroad fireman, who had been drinking, resisting him, and in the fray Schell shot

Frazer dead on the spot.

May 10, 1904: Habeas Corpus Proceedings — Action Brought to Test Validity of Bond Submitted for Tom Bandy — In the case of the state of Kansas against Tom Bandy, petition for a writ of habeas corpus was filed in the district court by Wilson Bros., Bandy's attorney, to test the validity of the bond for the prisoner's release.

The matter will be heard before Judge Smith in chambers.

School. The award is given each year to a graduating senior who has achieved distinction as a pianist. The Goodland Federated Music Club evaluates nominations and recommends to the family the senior who should receive the award.

Man sells St. Francis home to New York man in eBay auction

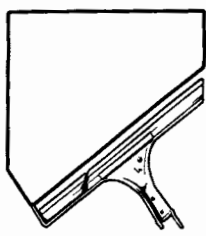

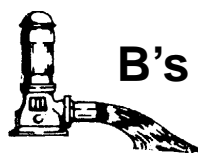

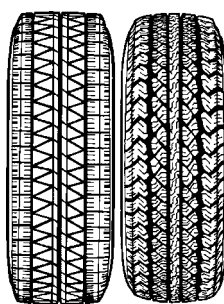
