Trojans advance to next round

The Colby Community College baseball team won the first two games of its best-of-three series against Neosho County Community College in Chanute on Sunday, moving on to the next round of the Region VI playoffs.

The Trojans defeated Neosho County 6-1 and 11-9 and improved their record to 27-31. They will face Johnson County Community College in the next round at 2 p.m. (Central Time) Thursday at Lawrence-Dumont Stadium in Wichita. The winner will play the winner of Thursday's game between Allen County and Seward

County community colleges. The Trojans ended their regular season May 9 on a five-game losing streak. After beating McCook Community College 11-1 in a single non-conference game on May 3, Colby lost 5-0 and 10-4 to Pratt Community College the next day On May 8, the Trojans dropped both games to Seward County 4-2 and 3-0. The next day Colby dropped a 6-5 decision to Butler County Community in a continuation of a game that was suspended due to rain last month.


The "Fury of the Plains" tournament offer competition in both Greco-Roman and freestyle wrestling. Entry fee is \$15 for one style or \$20 for both

Megan Hillebrand, a freshman at Colby Community College, placed seventh in the pole vault at the National Junior College Athletic Association track meet held May 6-8 in Levelland, Texas.

Hillebrand cleared 10 feet 8.75 inches to set a new school record and her herself All-American honors. Sophomore Kaela Thayer and freshman Tawny Rice also qualified for the national meet in the pole vault. Thayer finished 15th clearing 9 feet 9 inches and Rice failed to clear the opening height.
