The Cowboys track and field team won the Northwest Kansas League meet in Oakley on Friday and the Cowgirls came in second



Dan Melia was one of two double-winners for Goodland, taking first in the 110-meter high hurdles in 15.43 seconds and the 300-meter intermediate hurdles in 41.52 seconds. Melia was second in the pole vault.

Espiririon "Speedy" Aguilar was the other Cowboy with two golds, winning the 800-meter dash in 2 minutes 1.97 seconds and the 1,600-meter run in 4 minutes 59.01 seconds. He ran second in the 3,200-meters.

Lance Tedford won the long jump with a leap of 20 feet 6 inches. Tedford was part of the winning 4x100-meter relay team along with Josef Felver and Jared Doke, both 2004 graduates, and with junior

Wrestler heading for Colorado

Cowboys senior Blayze Bahe, who won the 2004 state Class 4A wrestling championship at 119 pounds, will wrestle for the Bears of the University of Northern Colorado in Greelev next season. Bahe was one of 74 Goodland High School

students who graduated Saturday. A four-year letter winner for the Cowboys

in wrestling, he qualifying for the state tournament all four years. As a freshman, in 2001, Bahe finished fourth at the state tournament at 112 pounds. The next year, as a sophomore, he was the state runner-up in the same weight class.

Bahe moved up to 119 pounds in 2003, his junior year, finishing fourth at the state championships. This past season he finished with a 35-1 overall record, losing only to Tanner Dawson of Abilene High School on Jan. 17. Bahe defeated Dawson the other two times they met, the final matches at the regional and state tournaments.

The University of Northern Colorado is about 160 miles northwest of Kansas and about 40 miles north of Denver. Next season, Northern Colorado will be in its second year of its four-year transition period from NCAADivision II to Division I.

Bahe joins six other freshmen wrestlers who recently signed letters of intent with Northern Colorado. All six were state tournament qualifiers in Colorado and four were state champions.

The Bears finished 3-10 last season in dual meets in a schedule that included seven Division I opponents and six Division II schools. Coach Jack Maughan said next season will be Northern Colorado's first full Division I dual schedule.

There are 10 weight classes in college wrestling, compared to 14 in high school, starting at 125 pounds.
