Statue alive on hill at Oakley


Colby Free Press A slice of the Old West returned to northwest Kansas Saturday in Oakley with the dedication of a bronze depicting William F. "Buffalo Bill" Cody hunting down a buffalo.

The weekend featured a parade with horses, re-enactors and more, the dedication on Saturday, a hot air balloon festival and displays at the Fick Fossil and History Museum.

Lewis Evins, president of Farmers State Bank in Oakley, kicked off the dedication with a speech revealing some of Cody's history and the efforts to bring the statue to the

"Cody is a person any county would be proud to claim as an icon," he said.

time as a hunter in Logan County, where he also took part in a contest that earned him the nickname "Buffalo Bill." To see who would keep the name, Evins said Cody went up Comstock to see who could kill the most buffalo in one day.






