**Mustangs close out track season**

The track and field season for Grant Junior High School ended May 8 at the Northwest Kansas League Meet in Hoxie.

The seventh-grade girls team finished eighth and the eighth-grade girls seventh. The seventh-grade boys were fifth and the eighth-grade boys third.

For the seventh-grade Lady Mustangs, Michelle Smith took first place in the shot put with a toss of 31 feet. Other girls earning points were Courtney Sheldon who placed fourth in the pole vault, Danielle Pettibone who was sixth in the 100-meter dash and Erika Gonzales who was sixth in the 200-meter dash. The 4x400-meter relay team of Gonzales, Sheldon, Linsey Owens and Shelbi Herl finished fifth.

Eighth-grade girls earning points include Ashley Christians who placed third in the long jump and

Samantha Raymer who was fourth in the pole vault. Halli Stone placed fifth in the 3,200-meter run, Heidi Yonkey was sixth in the 100-meter dash and Christians finished in a tie for sixth at 200 meters.

The 4x100-meter relay team of Yonkey, Marisa Acuff, Holly Kibel and Amanda Amthor finished sixth as did the 4x200-meter team of Raymer, Acuff, Andrea Wolak and Christians.

For the seventh-grade Mustangs, Fernando Martinez placed second in the 100-meter dash and Casey House was second in the discus. Martinez also placed fifth in the high jump. Andrew Taylor was fifth in the 100-meter hurdles and Kade Sheldon was fifth in the pole vault. Alberto Ruiz finished sixth in the 100-meter dash and Taylor was sixth in the high jump. The 4x100-meter relay team placed third.

For the eighth-grade boys, T.J. Hawkins won the high jump. Placing second for the Mustangs were Casey Henderson in the 100-meter dash, Hawkins in the 400-meter dash and Dustin Pennington in the 100-meter hurdles. Third-place finishers were Pennington in the 3,200-meter run, Tanner Smith in the triple jump and Nathan Heiter in the discus.

In the pole vault, Grant Wilkens placed fourth and Smith fifth. Wilkens was fifth in the 100-meter hurdles. Placing sixth were Josh Doke in the 200-meter dash, Toby Hurst in the 800-meter run, Forrest Trachsel in the long jump, Jake Kling in the 100-meter dash and Henderson in the shot put.

The eighth-grade Mustang 4x-100-meter relay team placed second, the 4x200-meter team fifth and the 4x400-meter team sixth.

**Cowboy Gold Wrestling Camp at Max Jones Monday, Tuesday**

Former Olympic wrestling coach Mike McArthur will be the instructor at the Cowboy Gold Wrestling Camp on Monday and Tuesday at the Max Jones Fieldhouse.

There will be two sessions for advanced wrestlers, in both junior high and high school, on both days from 9 to 11 a.m. and from 5 to 7 p.m. There will be one session for novice wrestlers, in grade school, on both days from 1 to 2:30 p.m.

McArthur was a three-time NCAA All-American with the University of Minnesota and later an

assistant coach there. He also was an assistant coach at Oklahoma State University and the U.S. Air Force Academy. He was on the coaching staff of the United States' 1995 World Championship team and the 1996 Olympic freestyle team.

He was the head coach for Athletes in Action Wrestling from 1986 to 1990 and was the coach for the 1998 World Cup team. He is a member of the Athletes in Action Wrestling coaching staff. Athletes in Action Wrestling, a ministry of

Campus Crusade for Christ, has been training and developing wrestlers for more than 20 years.
