Mildred Ruth Kemp Gilbert, 94, Goodland, a homemaker and housekeeper, died Thursday, May 27, 2004, at the Sherman County Good Samaritan Center.

She was born May 19, 1910, in Adams, Neb., the daughter of Medora (Adkins) and John Brown. She had 11 brothers and sisters and was 5 years old when her mother died.

Shortly thereafter, her father remarried, and her stepmother Leona took responsibility for the children. The family moved frequently with her father, who was an evangelist. He worked throughout Nebraska and Colorado until they settled in Fort Morgan, Colo., where Ruth attended high school and worked at a cannery.

When she was 16, she began living with her sister, Vernice Stevens and family, near Kanorado, and worked as a housekeeper for a family in Burlington. She attended the Gospel Hall north of Kanorado, where she met her husband, A. Franklin Kemp.

On May 19, 1928, they were married by the justice of the peace in Burlington. They lived with his family or in various homes north of Ruleton until 1943.

In 1943, the Kemps moved to Goodland, and Mrs. Kemp worked at retail stores and businesses. In 1956, Mr. Kemp died. She married Ralph Gilbert of Denver in 1958,

and they lived in Denver until 1990, when they moved to Goodland. He died April 20, 1992.

She was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars and American Legion auxiliaries and, in the past, the Goodland Gardenettes.

Also preceding her in death were her parents; a son, Willis; two sons-in-law, Sam Dizmang and Fred Schultz; a grandchild; and a great-grandchild.

Survivors include three daughters, Lois Dizmang of Goodland, Ellen (Gary) Losey of Logan and Leona Schultz of Independence, Iowa; two sons, Willard F. (Zita) Kemp of Fort Collins, Colo. and Wayne (Nordi) Kemp of Plant City, Fla.; a daughter-in-law, Sue Kemp of LaVista, Neb.; 13 grandchildren; 21 great-grandchildren; and seven great-great-grandchildren.

Services were at 10 a.m. this morning, Tuesday, June 1, 2004, at Koons Chapel in Goodland with the Rev. Janet Hernandez officiating. Burial will follow in the Goodland Cemetery.
