Former Cowboy earns academic honor

Bryce Abbey, a junior at the University of Nebraska at Kearney, was named to the second team of the College Sports Information Directors of America Academic All-District VII At-Large Team.

Abbey, an exercise science major, maintained a 3.41 grade average. Wrestling at 125 pounds, he finished the season 37-5 and placed third at the national meet in March.

Abbey, the son of Mike and Lorrie Abbey of Goodland, is a 2001 graduate of Goodland High School.

Joining Abbey on the all-district second team is a junior teammate, Adam Keiswetter, who posted a 3.68 grade average as a health and physical education major. Keiswetter placed fifth at the national

meet at 133 pounds.

Both Abbey and Keiswetter were first team NCAA Division II All-Academic picks by the Wrestling Coaches Association.

Former Trojan wrestler makes Olympic team

Daniel Cromier, who helped Colby Community College win the 1999 National Junior College Athletic Association wrestling championship, will represent the United States as a member of the freestyle wrestling team at this fall's Olympic Games in Athens.

Cromier won both his matches at 96 kilograms (211.5 pounds) at the Olympic trials May 20 in Indianapolis. He defeated former U.S. World Team member Tim Hartung in both matches, winning by a fall in the first and a 7-0 decision in the second.

Cromier wrestled for the Trojans his freshman and sophomore years, winning the national championships in 1998 and 1999. He went on the wrestle for Oklahoma State University his junior and senior years.

Cromier is the 2003 U.S. Nationals and Pan American Games champion.
