

Slice of good life benefits regional medical center

Winning the Malady flight was the team of Ramona and Penny Livengood and Connie Sheldon. Second place went to the team of Brenda McCants, Janet Warren and Scott McPhail. The third-place team consisted of Marilyn Imel, Lynda Townsend and Joan Reid.

Some of the “hole” prize winners were Daniel Woodburn and Mary Ann Elliott for being the man and woman with the closest tee-shot to the pin. The prizes for the longest drive in the fairway went to Joshua Bryan and Connie Livengood. The longest putt went to Ron Vignery and Penny Livengood.
