The Goodland Star-News At least six members of the Goodland High School Class of 2004 will continue their athletic careers in college next year.

Three Goodland graduates will join NCAA Division I athletic programs next year, and three others signed letters of intent with schools belonging to the Kansas Jayhawk Community College Conference.

• Jordan Bedore will play football for the Wildcats of Kansas State University next season. Kansas State, a member of the Big 12 Conference, finished 11-4 last season, including a 35-28 loss to Ohio State in the Fiesta Bowl.

Jordan, the son of Dustin and Barb Bedore of Goodland, was the Cowboys' leading rusher in 2003, gaining 1,685 in 11 games. He led the team in scoring with 112 points by scoring 18 touchdowns, all on the ground, and a pair of extra points. As the Cowboys' middle linebacker, he led the team in tackles with 145, including 40 solo.

Bedore will play for the West Team at the 2004 Kansas Shrine Bowl All-Star Game on July 31 in Emporia.

Bedore was this year's state Class 4A heavyweight wrestling champion. He competed in the shot put and discuss for the Cowboys track and field team.

• Alisha McKee will head for California State University, Fresno, this fall, where she will play volleyball for the Lady Bulldogs. Fresno State, a member of the Western Athletic Conference, finished 21-7 last season.

Alisha, the daughter of Jerry and Linda McKee, helped to lead the Cowgirls to the 2004 state Class 4A championship and a 38-2 overall record. She led the team in kills with 354 and was second in sevice aces with 58. McKee was one of four Cowgirls to receive post-season All-League honors by the Northwest Kansas League.

McKee also played for the Colorado Juniors Volleyball Club on its 18-year-olds team.
